Tom Monahan joined the Business First start-up team as a reporter in July 1984. He was named managing editor that fall and promoted to editor and vice president a year later. He was named president and publisher on January 1, 1995.

Monahan grew up in South Bend, Indiana, and graduated from Indiana University in 1974 with degrees in journalism and sociology. He began his Louisville newspaper career in 1974 as a reporter with The Record, the weekly Catholic newspaper.

Monahan chaired the 2012 Metro United Way campaign. He also serves on the boards of Greater Louis-ville Inc.; the Fund for the Arts; the Catholic Education Foundation, and the Greater Clark County Schools Educational Foundation. He also is a member of the advisory board of the Young Professionals Association of Louisville.

Monahan has served as president of the Better Business Bureau board, chair of the New Directions Housing Corp. board and chair of the Leadership Louisville Center board.

# SERVICE PROJECTS - New Review/Funding Process Kevin Wardell, Service Projects Committee Chair

For the first time, all service projects (already established and proposed) will be reviewed simultaneously prior to the start of the new Rotary Club year. New, streamlined "Project Proposal" forms must be submitted before April 15. After receipt, all projects will be reviewed at the same time by the Service Projects Committee which will approve projects and set priorities. Projects requiring funding will be forwarded to the Rotary Fund Board for review and possible funding. Some projects may receive multiple year approvals so that only periodic future reviews are required. Reviews will be completed (prior to August 31) in time for the club to submit eligible projects for District grants and Rotary International's global grants. The current list of projects to be reviewed are:


