Christopher 2X has been an active voice for the voiceless since 2004. After a controversial police shooting involving a 19-year-old black male, Christopher 2X's leadership abilities were revealed during a moment of conflict when the officer was acquitted and young blacks wanted to riot in the streets. 2X calmed the storm and continues to smooth difficult situations.

In March 2006 Christopher 2X took to public airways to expand the message about anti-violence situations, the root causes of violence, poverty, at risk youth and subsequent incarceration issues. In 2007 Christopher

2X initiated the Fight Crimes Against Children Partnership awareness campaign. In 2009, "From the Corner to the Courthouse: Both Sides of Justice," was created for the purpose of educating the grassroots community about the judicial system, the workings of the court, and all of its respective connections. Christopher was appointed to Mayor Fischer's Violence Prevention Work Group recently.

Christopher 2X has been featured on national programs such as **Dateline NBC**, **A&E First 48** and will be featured in an upcoming **PBS Frontline documentary** about his work on violent crimes and incarceration issues. In his presentation to the Rotary Club of Louisville, Christopher 2X will discuss his mission to bring a healing presence to chaotic and violent situations that arise throughout the Louisville Metro community.

March 7, 2013 Rotary Meeting

On March 7, 2013, we met in the Kosair Shrine Club Ballroom on South Second Street. President Stuart Alexander welcomed us, and Maria Smith gave the invocation. Gordon Costley led us in the Pledge; and we sang "My Wild Irish Rose" accompanied by Charlie Castner on piano. President Stuart welcomed our only visiting Rotarian, all the way from Lexington. We had 13 guests. Larry Sloan announced three Rotarians at the Birthday Table, and we wished them a Happy Birthday.

President Stuart announced that our next meeting will be in the Kosair Shrine Club Ballroom on March 14. Christopher 2X will speak on "Metro Violence; Healing and Rebirth." President Stuart reminded us that Rotary Day at the Downs will be held on Thursday, April 30. He gave a status report on the Rotary Promise Scholarship Fund, from which we will make a \$250,000 gift to Jefferson Community and Technical College on April 1. Tom Bohnert presented the Rotary Financial Report, saying "nothing is more fun than giving an investment report in the middle of a bull market." The Ro-

tary Fund presently is valued at over \$1.8 million. It returned 12.61% last year; and we are up over 3.1% in 2013. Michelle Griffin introduced our newest member, Bill Roby, Sr.

David Dunn introduced our guest speaker, Valle Jones, a Louisville native who returned to restore and re-develop the cast-iron façade brick "Whiskey Row" structures on Main Street. The buildings date from 1850 to 1890 and are in varying conditions of decrepitude and collapse. Valle is the daughter of the late Larry Jones, corporate lawyer, magician and illusionist, aka "Baron LaValle" and "Professor Squirrelly" (eponym of "Professor Squirrelly's Tea House"). With her brother, around 2003 Valle secured financing and acquired their late father's "Tea Room" property at Second and Main. In 2008, they acquired the adjacent Burwinkle-Hendershot building just as Lehman Bros. foundered and the world economy tanked. Valle and her team began their work by salvaging, saving and shoring-up the properties. With the National Trust Foundation on board as a consultant, Valle's team developed and implemented a comprehensive plan for 120,000 square feet of the historical Whiskey Row properties in the very heart of Louisville's latest urban *risorgimento*. Valle closed with her late father's words: "Imagination determines the limit of possibility." We gave Valle a standing ovation. — *Stan Whetzel*


