LouCity co-chairman Mike Mountjoy and Head Coach James O'Connor have influenced the Louisville community in a number of unique ways since the soccer team's announced arrival in June 2014.

Mr. Mountjoy's involvement in the LouCity's economic development has been a major part of the team's growth since day one. A founding partner of Mountjoy Chilton Medley CPAs & Advisors, Mountjoy has put his economic background to excellent use in helping to guide the club's soccer stadium efforts in the Butchertown district. His efforts in paving the path for LouCity's

future have been of paramount importance as Louisville continues to embrace its favorite soccer team and championship-winning team.

March 8, 2018 - ROTARY MEETING RECAP



Our March 8th Rotary Club meeting featured **Jason Criss Howk**, US Army Major (retired) and Author. Jason began his presentation by stating that Islam is a religion; however, it is not a "religion of peace," nor is it a "religion of war," as these labels are commonly used by people. Islamism is a political ideology and ISIS is a violent group of extremists. While ISIS' goal is for the Middle Eastern caliphate to survive, grow and prosper, it has been substantially reduced over the past decade by U.S. and allied forces. Jason also explained that Sharia Law is simply a list of "do's and don't's" of Islam, as outlined by the Quran. The Quran contains 114 chapters which are not listed/published

chronologically. Throughout his presentation, Jason emphasized the importance of providing people with accurate information regarding Islamism in order to combat the myths and falsehoods. Jason ended his presentation by opening the floor to Rotarians for questions.
