**Charlotte Gay Stites, MD** is the founder of the Smoketown Family Wellness Center, an innovative healthcare startup in the heart of Smoketown, Louisville's first African American neighborhood. The nonprofit center will combine medical care for children with healthy lifestyle support for the entire family, partnering with parents and the entire Smoketown community to raise children to be healthy in mind, body and spirit. The Center is on schedule

to open in the fall of this year in the historic Presbyterian Community Center.

Dr. Stites is passionate about improving healthcare outcomes by focusing on prevention. She participated in Leadership Louisville's 2016 class of Bingham Fellows with the topic of "Empowering Citizens to Lead Healthier Lives." In 2016, she received the Physician Excellence in Community Health Award presented by Humana.

Prior to founding the Center, Dr. Stites was in private practice in Louisville for 15 years with Kaplan Barron Roth Lehocky, PSC and East Louisville Pediatrics, PSC. She completed her residency training in Pediatrics at Oregon Health Sciences University in Portland, OR, her medical degree at the University of Kentucky and her undergraduate degree in English from the University of Virginia. She is married and the proud mother of three.
