Our March 22nd Rotary Club meeting featured **Beth Malcom**, President and CEO of KY YMCA Youth Association as well as our **Unsung Heroes Program**. Beth talked about how our youth are leaders of today, not tomorrow. She shared a story about a student named Damien and his triumph of getting his voice heard while speaking about bicycle helmet safety at an event with over 1000 of his peers. The bill he was

advocating for was passed and Damien continues to advocate for his community. Beth explained that this is the goal of the KY YMCA Youth Association - to develop youth into engaged citizens and servant leaders who are inspired to affect change in their schools, communities, and the world. Through experiential learning, service, and community activism, the KY YMCA Youth Association fosters critical thinking, leadership and social responsibility in teens. With technology in their hands, the youth have more power to cause change than ever before. Teens currently have a \$30 million dollar impact on the state of Kentucky through volunteer work with non-profit organizations. Beth challenged the Rotary Club to continue to give our youth a voice through mentoring and supporting service projects.
