Dr. Donna Hargens has been the Superintendent of Jefferson County Public Schools (JCPS) since 2011. As the Board Chair stated, "Her experience in raising student achievement, her overall leadership approach, and her commitment to diversity and student assignment make her the best choice to lead our district." As a child, Donna cultivated a lifelong love of reading, a curiosity about the world around her, and a determination to become the first person in her family to attend college. She exceeded this goal by graduating *summa cum laude* with a bachelor of arts degree from Marquette University. She earned an M.Ed. in educational administration and supervision from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, and Seton Hall University awarded her an Ed.D. in educational leadership, management, and policy.

Donna spent 22 years of her educational career in the Wake County Public School System in Raleigh, NC, where she held a variety of positions that included interim superintendent, chief academic officer, assistant superintendent for curriculum and instruction, area superintendent, and principal of two high schools. As JCPS Superintendent, Donna remains focused on raising student achievement for all students and is relentless in expecting staff to collect and analyze data to inform their decisions. Her leadership style is grounded in collaboration, and she devotes extensive time to listening to staff, parents, and community members to gain their perspectives and insights before making recommendations. She also keeps her finger on the pulse of our community by serving on the Mayor's Safe and Healthy Neighborhoods Advisory Committee, the Fund for the Arts Board, the Greater Louisville Inc. Board of Directors, and the Kentucky Science Center Board, among others. Donna enjoys being a part of the thriving city of Louisville and takes great care in guiding the educational experiences of more than 101,000 JCPS students. Donna and her husband, Jeremy, have two adult children, Jenna and Josh, and one granddaughter.

May 15, 2014 Rotary Meeting

The Rotary Club of Louisville held its May 15, 2014 meeting at the Galt House in the Archibald Room. Presiding was Past President Merrily Orsini. The invocation was given by Club Treasurer Joey Bailey. Barbara Collins led the Pledge of Allegiance and introduced our special entertainment, soloist Rob Carlson and pianist Jim Rightmyer, who performed a medley of Stephen Foster songs.

Current Club President Randy Coe was called to the podium to introduce District Governor Ed Kalmey, and to recognize Stan Klausing, Chair of the Rotary District Speech Contest, and Michael Brumleve, Louisville Metro Speech Contest Coordinator and a member of our Club. Past President Merrily then invited Club members to introduce their guests.

Michael Brumleve then explained the format of the speech contest. 
