Dr. Michael Saag is a Professor of Medicine at the University of Alabama Birmingham and the Director of the UAB Center for AIDS Research. A Louisville native and Ballard High School class of 1973 graduate, Dr. Saag has become one of the world's most renowned researchers of the HIV virus. Dr. Saag earned his medical degree with honors from the University of Louisville. He completed his residency and infectious disease fellowship training at UAB. During his fellowship, Dr. Saag conceived the concept of a comprehensive HIV outpatient clinic dedicated to the provision of comprehensive patient care and clinical outcomes research.

Dr. Saag has published over 280 articles in peer review journals. He has contributed 50 chapters to medical textbooks, served on the Editorial Board of AIDS Research and Human Retroviruses, and co-edited a textbook entitled

AIDS Therapy. Dr. Saag has spoken all over the world about his research. In December 2010 Dr. Saag was awarded the President's Medal of UAB, the highest honor given at this institution.

The World Health Organization considers the HIV infection to be a pandemic. From its discovery in 1981, AIDS killed more than 25 million people. In 2009 AIDS claimed an estimated 1.8 million lives, including approximately 260,000 children. Treatment with antiretroviral drugs reduces both the mortality rate and the morbidity of HIV infection.

## Rotary Meeting - May 17, 2012

President "Stet" Stetten rang the bell promptly at 12:15 and called the meeting to order. Bill Rutledge offered the invocation followed by Bob Slider who led us with the Pledge of Allegiance and the song of the day, "We're in the Money". Charlie Castner was at the piano.

Paul Gold introduced members celebrating birthdays this week. President Stet congratulated two Rotarians celebrating noteworthy anniversaries. Bill Yancey, M.D. has been with the club for 15 years and Bill Tafel received special recognition from President Stet in honor of 50 years of Rotary service. Other announcements and business included:

- President Stet thanked everyone involved for a safe and fun Rotary Shooting Event on May 12.
- The next Rotary Night Out is Wednesday, June 6<sup>th</sup> at the Pendennis Club.
- Harriette Friedlander announced the next Repair Affair an opportunity to help one of the community's elderly continue to live in their home by helping with needed repairs.
- Joey Bailey announced Rotary Day at the Louisville Bats Wednesday, June 30 at 11:30.
- Greg Braun discussed various ways of purchasing tickets for the upcoming Rotary Centennial Celebration Event on July 21.

Henry Heuser, Jr. introduced Barbara Sexton Smith, President and CEO of the Fund for the Arts, as our newest member. President Stet presented Barbara with the membership materials and welcomed her to the club.

Maria Hampton introduced our speaker, Dr. James Bullard, President of the Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis. Dr. Bullard shared that, generally speaking, the U.S. economy has done better than expected during the first part of 2012. The two most significant issues we currently face are the instability in the European economy and the need to get our own fiscal situation under control here in the United States. He commented that, while low interest rates were fine for a short period, very low rates over an extended period of time were a concern. Very low rates distort business decisions and are associated with bubbles in asset values.

Dr. Bullard's also shared some thoughts relative to the Fed's outlook – primarily that growth in the US economy will continue at a moderate pace and the labor market will continue to grow at a rate that is "not great, but positive". Lastly, inflation in the U.S. is currently about 2.3%, down slightly from a year ago and just above the target of 2%. The meeting adjourned at 1:00 p.m. - Alan Singleton
