

Raza Ahmad Rumi is a Pakistani policy analyst, journalist and an author. He has been a leading voice in Pakistan's public arena against extremism and human rights violations. With solid policy experience through his work for Government of Pakistan and the Asian Development Bank {as Governance Specialist}, Raza joined journalism in 2008. Since then, he has been an editor at The Friday Times, Pakistan's foremost liberal weekly paper.

Rumi also worked in broadcast media as a leading commentator and hosted talk shows at Capital TV and Express News. He was Director at Jinnah Institute, a public policy think tank and Exec-

utive Director of Justice Network- a coalition of NGOs. As a freelance policy professional, he has been advising international development organizations, governments and NGOs; and heads NAPSIPAG - a regional network on governance.

Rumi's writings are archived at www.razarumi.com. His recent book 'Delhi by Heart' was published by Harper Collins (2013). Raza has also authored several papers on governance, security, justice, arts and culture. In March 2014, he survived an assassination attempt in which his driver lost his life. Within weeks, he left Pakistan and has been affiliated with New America Foundation and the United States Institute of Peace. Raza holds a Bachelor degree in Economics and Masters degree in Social Planning, both from the London School of Economics.



May 21, 2015 Rotary Meeting

The meeting was called to order by President Kevin Wardell. The invocation was provided by Deborah Dietzler. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Rick King, who also led the Club's members in the recitation of the Rotary Four Way Test. Various guests were introduced. Kristin Willard introduced the celebrants at the birthday table. President Kevin made several announcements and Next week's speaker, Raza Ahmad Rumi, is a Pakistani policy analyst, journalist and author who has also been a leader against extremism and human rights violations in Pakistan. In March 2014, Rumi survived an attempt on his life.

Club Vice President Julie Schmidt reminded members to turn in any nominations that they may have for the Rotarian of the Year Award. Greg Braun reminded members of the Business Synergy event planned for 8 Up that evening. Matt Gardiner announced plans for the Garden Party at Boone-Gardiner Nursery. Finally, Dr. Bob Hilgers, during the Health Snippet segment, made a presentation on cervical cancer and the progress which has been made to fight this disease.

Julie Schmidt then introduced our speaker, Wil James Jr. Wil James is President of Toyota Motor Manufacturing Kentucky and oversees all aspects of Toyota's \$6 billion plant and operation in Georgetown. James is a director of both the National Urban League and BEAM. James focused his presentation on the importance of manufacturing in Kentucky (manufacturing provides 236,000 jobs in the Commonwealth) with a particular focus on Kentucky's automobile industry. Kentucky's history with automobile manufacturing goes back 100 years to the Model T. Toyota's footprint alone accounts for 21,000 direct and indirect jobs in Kentucky and over 85,000 jobs in Kentucky are related to automobile manufacturing (four assembly plants and over 400 suppliers); Kentucky ranks third in the U.S. in light vehicle manufacturing and ten percent of all vehicles assembled in the U.S. are produced in Kentucky.

Toyota's Georgetown plant has produced over 10 million cars, and beginning in October Lexus vehicles will also be produced in Georgetown ... this will add 750 new jobs at the site, along with 600 new engineering positions. Finally, James touted Toyota's new hydrogen fuel cell vehicle, the Mirai which will be introduced in select U.S. markets later this year.
