May 23, 2013 Rotary Meeting

Patrick Just gave the invocation, Gordon Costly led the Pledge and singing of *When You're Smiling* and Connie Cheak toasted four birthday celebrants. President Stuart thanked the



Rotary Promise Team for last weekend's Parklands events that netted over \$37,000. The first "Service Above Self" award went to Barbara Lankford (pictured at left). Keith Knapp promoted the June 15 Repair Affair, and Stet Stetten called for Rotarian of the Year nominations. Randy Coe distributed a survey about a lunch and parking price increase, and Stuart introduced new member attorney Brooke Egan, a partner in his firm.

President Stuart introduced Representative Bob M. DeWeese, M.D., (R-48) for an inside look at the Kentucky General Assembly. (We even had a filibuster during Q & A.) Bob had participated in medical politics, "but I had no intention to go into the real political arena

where they shoot real bullets," he said. Redistricting left his Glenview House seat vacant, however, and friends convinced him to run. Even when elected, Bob intended to serve briefly, then return to practice surgery with his son. On the morning of the big snowstorm in January 1994, though, he couldn't see. He regained normal vision in his right eye, but his depth perception was gone. "There's no demand for a blind surgeon," he quipped, so he's now serving his tenth consecutive two-year term, serving on key committees and as House Minority Caucus Chairman since 2001.

The governor traditionally dictated each legislature's actions, but legislative independence began with Gov. John Y. Brown's hands-off policy. A constitutional amendment meant the Lt. Gov. no longer presided over the Senate, giving the Senate President equal power with the Speaker of the House. The shift to annual sessions further strengthened the General Assembly and, when Republicans gained control of the Senate in 2000 for the first time in the state's history, Bob said it brought a true two-party system.

Bob likened the tortuous path a bill must take to become a law, to running a 100-yard minefield. Accomplishments of the 2013 session included pension reform, cleanup of the 2012 pain mill bill, accountability of special taxing districts, and industrial hemp. Work to be done in 2014 includes tax modernization, adopting a balanced budget, legislative redistricting and management of the expanding Medicaid program, "that already soars out of control from a cost and management perspective."
