Retired United States Secret Service June 2, 2016 Guest Speaker

Topic - USSS in Age of Terrorism: 31 Years Protecting Presidents

A native of Louisville, David graduated from Centre in 1959 with a degree in business administration. He immediately began a promising career with the R.J. Reynolds Tobacco Company, but by 1964 a desire for a little more adventure became irresistible. He contacted a friend and fellow alumnus, J. Frank Yeager, who had joined the U.S. Secret Service, and soon he had embarked on a whole new life.

David quickly established himself as a rising star in the Service. He was assigned to protect Richard Nixon during the 1968 campaign. He followed President Nixon to the White House, serving there until the end of the Nixon presidency, including accompanying the Nixon family home to California on Air Force One following Mr. Nixon's resignation. He continued to serve on Presidential and Vice-Presidential details, work that took him to more than fifty countries. But he also took on other duties, including the Dignitary Protection Division. In this role, he coordinated security for the 1978 Camp David Summit between Egyptian President Anwar Sadat, Israeli Prime Minister Menachem Begin, and President Jimmy Carter. He later (nore here)

Hello from Djibouti, Africa this Memorial Day. A lot has happened since I last wrote. I spent a week in Stuttgart, Germany attending a course to learn how to better work with our foreign partners. Germany was nice but nothing compared to getting to spend a week in Molesworth, England earlier this month. Located just over an hour outside London, I made the most of my time off. I visited Cambridge, St. Neots, and spent a few late nights in London doing the normal tourist stuff. I talked to every person that would carry on a conversation. From cab drivers, to bartenders and random Brits, I asked about the culture, current events and where the best places to visit that are located off the tourist map. his request: "Please do not send me any contraband or food. Boxes are x-rayed here and the food will melt. The country address is United States if asked. My wish list are koozies, t-shirts from different parts of the country (size L) and paperback/soft cover books on Marine and Naval history, the Middle East/Islam and the South." His address is:





MEMBERSHIP ENGAGEMENT

President Elect Alice Bridges: "Member engagement is key to the vitality of our Club. This survey feedback will help guide our efforts as we join together to do good in our community and world."





- 77% are satisfied with membership in our Rotary Club and 86% feel welcome. Moreover, nearly 90% are proud to be a member!
- Members believe Club meetings are a good use of time and rate them highly for length and quality of speakers and programs.
- 87% see our service projects as worthwhile and making a difference in the community and world, but only 63% participated in a project this year.
- Communications are well regarded with a preference for receiving information via emails and Sparks, and at club meetings.
- Calendars and competing commitments are a challenge to participation. About 35% said they frequently participate in the Club's activities, projects, and programs, with "other commitments that compete for my time" having the greatest impact on the decision to take part.
- Almost 65% said the club dues/lunch fees are "just right" while more than 32% said they were too high.
- Fewer than 43% agree they've invited qualified prospects to join, presenting a big opportunity to engage members in meeting goals for growth.
