The vitality, spirit and oratory abilities of these contestants as they deliver their speeches will be inspiring and challenging.

This year's topic is the 2012-13 Rotary Theme, "Peace Through Service," chosen by RI President Victoria Potter Sam Dugan McKenzie Wilson Sakuji Tanaka. President Tanaka said: "In Rotary, our business is not profit, our business is peace. Through our service, we learn empathy for others. We come closer to people who seem very different from us. And we begin to understand how alike we really area. However we define peace, whatever peace means to us, we can bring it closer through service."

The contestants are high school students from public and private schools, and each is sponsored by one or more Rotary Clubs in the area. Children of Rotarians are not eligible. Contestants speak without notes for a period of five to eight minutes, and will be judged on delivery, originality and content. This annual Speech Contest always generates much enthusiasm, as the students are competing to attain cash prizes: (1st place—\$1,000; 2nd place—\$500; 3rd place—\$500). 

May 2, 2013 Rotary Meeting

It was unquestionably "John Asher Day" from the opening bell to the closing. When introduced to give the Invocation, Don Kohler queried aloud, from a head table with one empty seat, "When will our speaker arrive?" When God did not reply, Don proceeded with a very appropriate Derby Week prayer, including concern for the horses. We were treated by two boy sopranos (Jobe and Aiden Arnold), who sang the National Anthem, as a duet, after our Pledge of Allegiance, followed by a medley of Stephen Foster and other regional songs, including "Camp Town Races" and "My Old Kentucky Home". As appropriate, just before every first Saturday in May when we have a bumper crop of visitors, twelve were introduced and welcomed. Four Rotarians celebrating birthdays were identified as present by Connie Cheek, although they were not sitting at the Birthday Table. President Stuart provided a report on "Rotary Day at the Downs" and spoke of forthcoming Club activities, followed by Janet Brown who described some exotic offerings at the "Live Auction" dinner later this month on May 17 at the Parklands — Gheens Foundation Lodge.

New member Blaine Grant was introduced by Tony Kemper, who pointed out that Blaine had once "been attacked by a lion" but survived "so that he might be a member of our Club." Charlie Oberst was then called on to "introduce our speaker", who indeed had arrived, and rightly said that, "John Asher", who addresses our Club every first week in May, really "needs no introduction."

Asher began his talk by explaining why he was late "I'm always a photo finish in arriving" but then added that his daughter is "expecting" during Derby Week, of all times. Drawing on an amazing memory of Derby history, he began with the 1913 Derby winner, "Donerail" who paid 91 to 1 and then recalled other races in years ending in "3", including the 1933 "fighting finish" when two jockeys were literally whipping each other as they approached the Finish Line, and 1973 when Secretariat won the first Triple Crown in 25 years, taking the Belmont Stakes by 31 lengths. He particularly relished the story of Funny Cide, Derby winner in 2003 owned by six men in New York who had been friends in high school and formed a consortium with \$5,000 from each to buy horses. He then spoke interestingly about ten of the twenty-one horses in this year's Starting Gate lineup, with facts about stables, owners, trainers, jockeys and horses. He concluded by hoping, quite unnecessarily, that he would be invited back next year. Of course he will! David Reed


