J.K. McKnight is a writer, musician, festival producer, and environmentalist. He currently works for AC Entertainment, and is the founder of The Forecastle Festival and The Forecastle Foundation. He is a graduate of St. Xavier High School and attended the College of Charleston, Bellarmine University, and the University of Louisville.

The Forecastle Festival, which began as a small community event at Tyler Park, has grown into an international attraction, with over 60,000 annual attendees from more than 1,800 cities, nearly every state and ten countries. For the second time, Rolling Stone Magazine named it one of the "Coolest Festivals" in America in 2014, with additional accolades from the New York Times, USA Today, LA Weekly, Chicago Sun-Tribune, SPIN, and many more. May 29, 2014 Rotary Meeting

The Rotary Club of Louisville convened on Thursday, May 29, 2014 at The Galt House. The meeting was called to order by Club President Randy Coe. The invocation was given by Paul Bickel, III. Alex Novak led the Club in the pledge of allegiance. The Club members joined in singing *My Country Tis of Thee*, in honor of the recent Memorial Day celebration. Leo Smith introduced the birthday table and the honorees who were present were honored with the singing of Happy Birthday. President Randy made some announcements concerning Club programs and visitors were introduced. Joey Bailey reminded members of the upcoming Rotary Day at the Bats game. Nelson Auge presented pins to members who had sponsored new Club members since July 2013.

Dr. Charles Oberst then introduced our guest speaker, Dr. Mark Slaughter. Dr. Slaughter is on the faculty at the University of Louisville and is also on staff at Jewish Hospital and is a world-renowned cardiologist. During his career, Dr. Slaughter has performed 50 heart transplants and has implanted 250 ventricular devices.

Dr. Slaughter began his presentation by providing an overview of heart disease (with particular emphasis on advanced stages of the disease and historical/traditional means of treating the disease). Heart disease kills more patients than cancer; however, cancer patients tend to live longer following their diagnosis (this illustrates the need to find cures to heart disease due to the short life cycle of patients, once diagnosed).

While heart transplants have been considered to be the best hope for those with the most advanced stages of heart disease, the work and research on ventricular devices that Dr. Slaughter has conducted with colleagues around the world is now beginning to provide better outcomes for patients in lieu of the more invasive transplant (implantation of the device requires only a six inch incision and does not require that the sternum be split). Additional work on this technology has yielded a very small pump (the size of an AA battery) that can literally be screwed into the bottom of the heart and provide full assistance to the heart's pumping capabilities (don't let the small size fool you, though, as this small pump costs \$196,000!). Perhaps most importantly, unlike transplants, the pump allows the heart to actually recover muscle, which is very important in the overall treatment. There being no further business, the meeting concluded with the recitation of the Rotary Four Way Test and was adjourned.
