During 17 years as president of the Better Business Bureau serving Louisville, Southern Indiana and Western Kentucky, Rotarian Charlie Mattingly has helped transform the Better Business Bureau locally and nationally. He served on the Board of Directors of the Council of Better Business Bureaus and chaired the BBB system's Brand Management Committee, which established www.bbb.org as the single web portal where consumers and businesses find all BBB services from any BBB in North America.

Charlie has been a leader in testing innovations to keep the BBB relevant and competitive during a period when Angie's List, Yelp, Google and dozens of other companies began offering services previously only available through the Better Business Bureaus. The BBB in Louisville now has 3,834 BBB Accredited Businesses, the largest member-

ship in its history.

Charlie will talk about BBB investigations of scams, complaint handling, BBB ratings of businesses, and BBB accreditation of businesses and charities that commit to BBB standards. He'll discuss newer BBB services such as Request A Quote and customer reviews (which landed him and our local BBB on the front page of the *Wall Street Journal* last year, in an article entitled, "Old Watchdog Learns New Web Tricks.")

Charlie was valedictorian of his 1983 class at the University of Louisville School of Law and is a member of the Kentucky Bar Association and Louisville Bar Association. He served for 25 years as a key staff member to retired U. S. Representative Ron Mazzoli. In his spare time, he enjoys golf and spending time with his wife, Mary, and his two sons and daughters-in-law.





May 30, 2013 Rotary Meeting

Bill Rutledge gave the invocation, Gordon Costley led the Pledge and singing, and President Stuart updated us on the previous day's ceremony for Rotary Promise Scholarship qualifying freshmen at Western High School. District Governor Nominee Mike Kull invited us to the District 6710 Assembly in Frankfort on June 8. Kelly Burke reminded us to make our reservations for the June 12 Zoo event and President-elect Randy Coe thanked members for their response to the "Lunch Site" survey. Stay tuned for an official announcement next week.

Rick Harned provided a snapshot of our club 50 years ago, in 1963. We met in the Brown Hotel then, with 378 active members in classifications reflective of a manufacturing economy with strong retail and wholesale trades. John Lueken introduced new member Jed Hayden, who practiced corporate law in Turkey and Dubai before starting his firm here.




Kevin Wardell, Jeffrey Bringardner, Steven Hester, M.D., MBA and President Stuart E. Alexander III

Kevin Wardell introduced our speakers for an update on the Affordable Care Act and Healthcare Reform. Steven Hester, MD, MBA is Norton Healthcare System Senior Vice President and Chief Medical Officer. Joining him for alternating five-minute segments was Jeffrey Bringardner, Humana-KY Market President.

Dr. Hester traced our evolution from patient to consumer in the changing delivery environment, contrasted the needs of four current generations and profiled six types of healthcare consumer, all of whom are seeking value—the best quality at the best price. Mr. Bringardner highlighted "Obamacare" features now in place, including dependent coverage to age 26, no lifetime limits, elimination of children's pre-existing condition exclusions and full coverage of preventive services. Next year the health insurance purchasing exchanges will begin, along with guaranteed issue, the end of adult pre-existing condition exclusions and new employer responsibility to play or pay. He said Humana will offer software apps to help employers evaluate their options.

We got a peek at the future of clinical care, when technology will improve care coordination and communication. Video visits will improve access in rural areas, effective teams of doctors and allied professionals will ease the doctor shortage, and engagement of patient populations will improve prevention and early diagnosis. Improved management of the top 100 complex patients will reap huge savings and better outcomes. Interest was so great that the Q&A session ran as long as the presentation.


