May 10, 2018 - ROTARY MEETING RECAP



Our May 10th Rotary Club meeting featured **Wes Cowan-** CEO of Cowan's Auctions. Prior to the start of the meeting, Wes appraised antiques that Rotarians brought with them. As an auctioneer and expert appraiser of historic American artifacts, furniture and documents, Wes provided insight on generational differences as seen through the exchange and value of antiques over decades. As has been characteristic of the "Baby Boomer" generation, they accelerated the antique market, primarily as recipients of inherited antiques from the preceding "Greatest Generation." We

are in the middle of changing times, as there is less and less interest in owning the heirlooms and more interest in modern decor and furnishings. As a result, more antiques are flooding into the market at a depressed value causing expectation management to be a challenge, but very important. On the bright side, social media has helped to optimize the value of art and antiques by connecting owners/sellers with buyers who have the highest literal and figurative "appreciation" of the value. "Social media can connect us to the value of art," Wes said. He shared a few recent "bluebird" examples, where very rare artifacts and art had re-appeared into the auction market and were sold at greater than \$1 million, after virtually disappearing for decades in obscurity of inherited ownerships, only to be rediscovered through social media posts.
