Topic - Fullfilling the Promise

Ty Handy, President and CEO of Jefferson Community & Technical College since early 2016, is dedicated to growing the educated population of the Louisville region. Ty has been a member in 2 other Rotary Clubs in both Indiana and Vermont. He is also a Paul Harris Fellow. Prior to coming to Louisville, Ty has served as President of several colleges including Ivy Tech in Sellersberg, IN.

His wife is a local artist, whose work is displayed at the Arts Council of Southern Indiana in New Albany. His son, Beau, is a Certified Financial Planner here in Louisville. His other son, Jonathan, is a faculty member at Furman University in South Carolina. Ty is the current state of Vermont bench press record holder in his weight/age category.

How our club + \$2 million help kids go to college!

Our club will recognize the first Rotary Promise Scholars graduating from Iroquois High School and the second class from Western High School. Eighty-one students have qualified! Our Rotary Club and JCTC created a pool of \$1 million per school to assure free tuition for each of the students who choose to attend JCTC. The University of Louisville and Indiana University Southeast will then offer scholarships for eligible Rotary Promise Scholars who graduate from JCTC and enroll to pursue a bachelor's degree.

Rotarian mentors will present medallions and certificates to the students in a special program from 11:00 - 11:45 in the Archibald Ballroom. All Rotarians are invited to come early and show our support.

Then, during our regular meeting beginning at noon, we will recognize and celebrate their achievement as a group and hear their principals tell us about the impact on their schools. We will also recognize our educational partners, our major donors, and our Rotary Promise leaders. We also invited several of the Rotary Promise Scholars from last year who are attending JCTC and U of L. Dr. Ty Handy, president of JCTC, will be our speaker and talk about the likely future impact of the Rotary Promise program as well as the state of the college and several exciting initiatives under way.
