Our May 10th Rotary Club meeting featured Maggie Payette Harlow- CEO of Signarama Downtown Louisville and the Rotary Promise Scholar Program. Maggie first conveyed through her own experience, that life is about learning and managing change. Change is uncomfortable, but success will come from being able to accept change. She then offered the Promise Scholars three "secrets:

- "You (Scholars) are just like us (Rotarians and Community Leaders). We are just like you. Everybody gets nervous about going into the unknown."

- You never graduate from learning, which requires constant change. You will be successful if you can adapt to change. Accept the discomfort as a positive aspect of what's needed to move forward.

- Successful people are willing to fail, and they turn failures into the data they need for achieving the next success.

Maggie then suggested that Scholars become comfortable in "learning to walk like babies." They stumble forward, fall down, get back up and try again, while others are watching. And babies often reach out for help when they need it.
