During our regular meeting, we celebrated their achievement as a group and heard their principals described the impact on their schools. We also recognized our education partners (JCTC, JCPS, U of L, IUS), our major donors, and our Rotary Promise club leaders. Several of the Rotary Promise Scholars from last year who are attending JCTC and U of L joined us as special quests.

Dr. Ty Handy, president of JCTC, spoke about "Fulfilling the Promise" which was timed to coincide with a column he contributed (link) to the Courier-Journal. We also premiered a special video (link) produced by Rotarian Ashley Brauer, Senior Account Executive at Guthrie-Mayes, with comments from several students and mentor coordinator, Walt Kunau.

Our Rotary Club and JCTC created a pool of \$1 million per school to assure free tuition for each of the students who choose to attend JCTC. The University of Louisville and Indiana University Southeast will then offer scholarships for eligible Rotary Promise Scholars who graduate from JCTC and enroll to pursue a bachelor's degree.

# Joint meeting - Rotary and FEI invite Dennis Berman of the WSJ to speak!

Dennis K. Berman is Business Editor of The Wall Street Journal, overseeing the staff and coverage of business around the globe. He also writes a column, "The Game," which covers the future of business. Berman was previously deputy bureau chief for Money & Investing, helping oversee the Journal's financial coverage during the 2008-2009 financial crisis and rebuilding its presence on WSJ.com. Prior to that he was Global Deals Editor, responsible for leading the Journal's coverage of mergers, private equity, and bankruptcy.

For four years, Mr. Berman was the Journal's mergers and acquisitions reporter, breaking news on a series of large deals, including Bank of America's purchase of Merrill Lynch, AT&T's purchase of BellSouth, Sprint's purchase of Nextel, and Federated Department Stores' purchase of May Department Stores. In 2007, he launched Deal Journal on WSJ.com, now one of the site's most popular destinations.

He graduated magna cum laude from the University of Pennsylvania, is a media fellow at the Hoover Institution at Stanford University and is a Kentucky Colonel.
