Russell Vandenbroucke is Professor of Theatre Arts at the University of Louisville and the founding director of its program in Peace, Justice, and Conflict Transformation. His books include *Truths the Hand Can Touch: The Theatre of Athol Fugard*, *Contemporary Australian Plays* (editor), and *The Theatre Quotation Book: A Treasury of Insights and Insights*.

He holds a Doctor of Fine Arts from the Yale School of Drama, was a Fulbright Scholar in Australia, and a Rotary Foundation World Peace Fellow in Thailand where he adapted and directed "An Evening with Global Peacemakers."

Recent writing includes entries for the *International Encyclopedia of Peace* and *Soldiers Circle*, which dramatizes the lives of young American soldiers in Iraq and Afghanistan. Other plays include: *Eleanor: In Her Own Words*, adapted from the writings of Eleanor Roosevelt; *Atomic Bombers*, which commemorated the 50th anniversary of Hiroshima; and *School Play*, inspired by the 50th anniversary of the Supreme Court's Brown v. The Board of Education decision ending school desegregation. His production of *Dead Man Walking*, based on Sr. Helen Prejean's book of the same name, plays at UofL next Jan. 29- Feb.2.

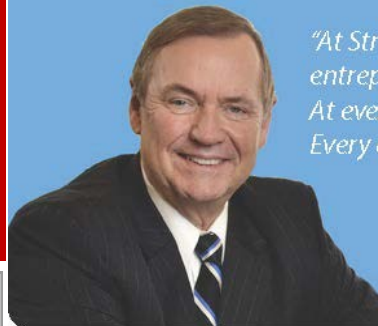

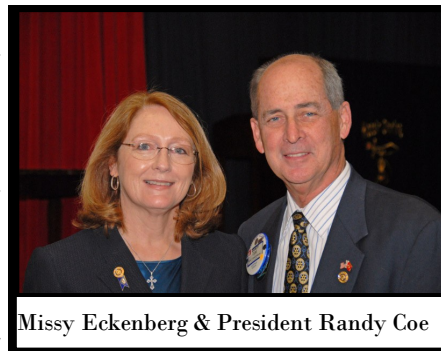
