Russell Vandenbroucke is Professor of Theatre Arts at the University of Louisville and the founding director of its program in Peace, Justice, and Conflict Transformation. His books include *Truths the Hand Can Touch: The Theatre of Athol Fugard, Contemporary Australian Plays* (editor), and *The Theatre Quotation Book: A Treasury of Insights and Insults.*

He holds a Doctor of Fine Arts from the Yale School of Drama, was a Fulbright Scholar in Australia, and a Rotary Foundation World Peace Fellow in Thailand where he adapted and directed "An Evening with Global Peacemakers."

Recent writing includes entries for the *International Encyclopedia of Peace* and *Soldiers Circle*, which dramatizes the lives of young American soldiers in Iraq and Afghanistan. Other plays include: *Eleanor: In Her Own Words*, adapted from the writings of Eleanor Roosevelt; *Atomic Bombers*, which commemorated the 50th anniversary of Hiroshima; and *School Play*, inspired by the 50th anniversary of the Supreme Court's Brown v. The Board of Education decision ending school desegregation. His production of *Dead Man Walking*, based on Sr. Helen Prejean's book of the same name, plays at UofL next Jan. 29- Feb.2.

Peace Fellowships are a Rotary International program initiated in 1999 and are highly competitive. There are only 60 scholarships for a Masters degree at one of seven universities around the world. Margaret will study and receive practical training at the University of Bradford, England, for two years, fully supported by RI. Peace Fellows study international relations, conflict resolution and development issues, supplemented by direct fieldwork. They are expected to stay involved with Rotary throughout their careers. 
