

Dr. Zipple is president and CEO of Seven Counties Services, the Louisville region's leading provider of behavioral health care and developmental services. The 1300 staff at Seven Counties serve over 30,000 different clients each year. Prior to joining Seven Counties in 2011, Tony served as CEO of Thresholds in Chicago, COO of Vinfen in Boston, and Professor and Senior Research Associate at Boston University.

Tony has over 35 years of experience as a clinical manager, public administrator, consultant, teacher, researcher, and executive in the field of behavioral health. He holds a Doctor of Science in Rehabilitation Counseling from Boston University, an MBA from the University of New Hampshire, a CAGS from the University of Cincinnati, and MS and BA degrees from the University of Notre Dame. Tony also has deep interests in coaching and positive psychology and is certified as a coach by the Inter-

national Coach Federation.

A licensed psychologist, Tony has authored over 60 articles, book chapters, monographs and books on topics related to community mental health. Tony is the recipient of the Irv Rutman Award presented by the U.S. Psychiatric Rehabilitation Association for excellence in administering a psychiatric rehabilitation program and the John Beard Award presented by the International Association of Psychosocial Rehabilitation Services for outstanding contributions to the field.

November 13, 2014 Rotary Meeting

The Rotary Club of Louisville convened on Thursday, November 13, 2014 in the Cochran Room. The meeting was called to order by Club President Kevin Wardell. The invocation was given by Penny Gold. Dick Brien led the pledge of allegiance, followed by the recitation of the Rotary Four-Way Test. The Club was then treated to a performance of "When Will I Be Loved," performed by the Rotary Rockin Band.

The Club then welcomed visiting Rotarians and guests. President Kevin requested that members keep guest introductions brief and to refrain from turning the introductions into a "commercial." David James recognized Club members who are celebrating birthdays. President Kevin then congratulated John Jennings for organizing the successful and first Business Synergy Night. Past President Stet Stetten reminded us of the December 11 deadline to submit Lifetime Service Award nominations.

Club member Kelly Burke announced a night out for the Broadway performance of *ONCE* at the Kentucky Center in January; dinner at the Bristol on West Main Street is optional. George Brakmeier reminded members of the upcoming Salvation Army bell-ringing season and encouraged members to sign up for slots at one of two loca-

tions: downtown Louisville and Holiday Manor Shopping Center. Alice Bridges informed the Club that November 15 will be a Volunteer Workday for the Club's Food Literacy Project at Oxmoor Farm. Greg Braun also reminded the Club of the upcoming holiday party.

Past President Woody Northup provided an overview of The Rotary Foundation (the major fundraising arm of Rotary International) and the Club's Rotary Fund of Louisville. Woody encouraged members to support The Rotary Foundation, pointing out that the Club has fallen behind on a per-capita basis the amount of giving when compared to other area clubs. Finally, President Kevin reminded Club members that the American Cancer Society's annual Great American *Smokeout* will be held on November 20, 2014.

Ken Grossman introduced our guest speaker: Wayne Estopinal, who is an architect in Jeffersonville and is also the owner of the Mocking-bird Valley Soccer Club in Louisville. Wayne Estopinal is the community leader most responsible for bringing professional soccer to Louisville – the Louisville City Football Club (Louisville City). Louisville City will be a member of the 22-team USL Professional Division (also known as USL Pro). Teams are located from coast to coast in major markets. Louisville City is affiliated with the Orlando City Football Club (the Orlando club is moving up to the Major League Soccer {MSL} division in 2015). Wayne Estopinal stated that the long-term goal is to bring MSL soccer to Louisville. Wayne also pointed out the favorable demographics which should support professional soccer in the Louisville Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA). At present, there are 17,000 active soccer players in the MSA. Professional soccer is the second favorite sport for 12 – 24 year olds after the NFL. Louisville City will play 15 home games in Slugger Field.

Wayne introduced the team's new coach – James O'Conner. Coach O'Conner has played in over 500 professional soccer matches in the UK and also played for the Orlando club. Coach O'Conner informed the Club that tryouts will be held in December and the first game will be played in March 2015. Louisville City players will come from all over the world and will serve as good role models for area young people. The meeting concluded with recitation of the Rotary Four Way Test and was adjourned.


