## **Rotary Meeting - November 29, 2012**

President Stuart Alexander called the meeting to order and Alan Griffes gave our invocation. Gordon Costley led us in the pledge and along with Charlie Castner on the piano, led us in "New York, New York" in honor of our speaker and his topic. We've never sounded better!

Paul Gold hosted our birthday table which had several celebrants. President Stuart reminded everyone of the Holiday Party at The Pendennis Club on Friday, December 7<sup>th</sup>. Members were previously emailed a link to pay for the party online.

Kevin Wardell gave a Rotary 101 presentation about Vocational Service. The three cornerstones of vocational service are ethical standards, importance of all useful oc-



cupations, and the application of our professional skills to our societal needs. Habitat for Humanity and Rotary Promise Scholarship Fund are some of their activities. Charlie Castner

introduced our newest member, Bobbie Rafferty, Chief Development Officer for Spalding University (pictured at left). Welcome Bobbie!

Mike Cronan then introduced his law partner, David Ratterman, as our guest speaker, and one of our own. With a background that includes engineering and construction law, David was asked to be a member of the FEMA team to understand the collapse of the twin towers shortly after their downfall on 9/11/01, and spoke of this to our club back in 2002. Now ten years later, David titled his presentation "Re-Birth!" *Click links to view video (two parts) of David's presentation:* Part 1 and Part 2.


David spoke briefly of the anatomy of the old twin towers and how the collapse occurred, and then explained the intricate design of the new structures. At 1,776 feet, tower one will be the tallest structure in America. The thickness of the walls at the base of the structure, the PSI of the concrete used, and the amount of reinforcing steel is well beyond the limits of any other building erected. The remains of over half of the 2,983 people who perished were never recovered, emphasizing the need for a significant memorial. The second piece of the "Re-Birth" is Memorial Plaza, which includes the names of all of those that perished, etched in metal.

The third piece of the "Re-Birth" at the site is the redesign and construction of the Transportation Hub, which is significant due to its location in lower Manhattan and its connectivity to New Jersey. How Much and Who Pays? That will be an issue for the Port Authority of New York for years to come. But the construction of this massive project is important to show the rest of the world our resiliency and resolve. *- Jerry Gerichs*
