Scott Brusaw has a vision that could lead to the end of our dependency on fossil fuels. His vision is to cover all asphalt surfaces that are exposed to the sun with Solar Road Panels that will recharge all-electric vehicles. He is aware that this won't happen overnight. Brusaw wants to start off small with driveways, bike paths, patios, sidewalks, parking lots, playgrounds, etc. "This is where we'll learn our lessons and perfect our system," he says. "Once the lessons have been learned and the bugs have all been resolved, we'll plan to move out onto public roads."

Scott is an electrical engineer with over 20 years of industry experience, and he holds multiple patents. He has served as the Director of Research and Development at a manufacturing facility in Ohio, and he has developed several networked control systems from the ground up.

Brusaw and his wife, Julie, reside in Idaho and own a facility where they are working to make their dream of a Solar Roadway become a reality. Scott Brusaw's talk is presented in partnership with this year's Festival of Faiths, which has the theme of *Sacred Fire: Light of Compassion*. Rotary Meeting - November 8, 2012

President Stuart Alexander called the meeting to order at the Kosair Shrine Club Ballroom, our second of three consecutive meetings to be held there. Lukas Dwelly, a former Marine, led us in our invocation, which focused on our veterans. After the presentation by the Color Guard, we sang the Star Spangled Banner, followed by Barbara Collins leading the choir in an Armed Forces Melody of songs in honor of upcoming Veterans Day.

Dr. Joe Kutz briefly introduced Dr. Lech, a visiting professor from Brazil. Thirty years ago, Dr. Lech was a Rotary Scholar, and he used that opportunity to study and has become a leading orthopedic doctor in Brazil. Dr. Lech expressed his thanks and gratitude for the opportunity that Rotary provided to him.

President Stuart then expressed special thanks to Mark Cowherd, who has transformed our video capabilities at meetings, and has been instrumental in providing video content available on Rotary's YouTube. Joe Ferguson hosted the birthday table, which include a whopping eight celebrants this week, including yours truly. Although we didn't get any ice cream, we were all happy to be there!



Marti Hazel introduced her boss, and our guest speaker, Bill Lamb, President and General Manager of WDRB and WMYO television, and one of our own. Bill's presentation was entitled the "Business of Television." Bill gave us a few facts about how television stations in Louisville are similar. WDRB is a network affiliate of Fox, which means they are not owned by Fox. The same for the other three stations in Louisville. Similarly, all of the four stations are not federally funded and earn their revenue from the sale of advertising. WDRB differs from the other three stations in that they receive only two hours of network programming per day, versus approximately 15 hours of network programming for the other three stations. This requires WDRB to supplement many more hours of programming with syndicated shows. Bill described many threats to television including iPads, iPhones, internet, DVRs and anything else that gets eyeball attention.

Broadcast television, as opposed to the other cable channels, continues to dominate from a viewership standpoint. The four stations in Louis-ville get 40-50% of the viewership, dwarfing all of the other cable channels. During the week of October 22nd, 48 of the top 50, and 93 of the top 100 shows were broadcast shows, not cable shows. Bill wonders who is exactly "Keeping up with the Kardashians."

Bill then went on to say how he thinks WDRB differs from the other stations in Louisville. Bill has written a book entitled "Money Follows Excellence", which describes in detail the WDRB business model. While other stations typically are structured with News as the centerpiece and driving force of their business, WDRB has structured the centerpiece of its model as being their Culture, which is excellence based. Bill feels that if all of the other departments of a station rally around their culture and work together hand-in-hand, they can create an organization that can truly be described as "Great" and leave a legacy for others to follow. This book, "Money Follows Excellence", appears to be not only good advice for running a television station, but could also apply to any of us in our businesses.


