Kentucky Governor Steve Beshear

Steve Beshear was elected Governor of Kentucky in 2007 and was re-elected in 2011. During his time in office, Gov. Beshear has focused on initiatives to help Kentucky families, particularly in the areas of health and health care, education and economic development. Kentucky's

health benefit exchange, known as kynect, has been hailed as a national model since its launch on Oct. 1, 2013, for its smooth operation and easy interface for users looking for affordable health coverage. Since enrollment began last fall, more than 421,000 Kentuckians (nearly 1 in 10) have enrolled for health care through kynect. Building on that success, this year Gov. Beshear launched the kyhealthnow initiative to significantly reduce incidence and deaths from diseases such as cancer, diabetes and heart disease and to improve the state's collective health. Christen Boone is the **President & CEO** of the **Fund for the Arts**, building a stronger, more vibrant community through the Arts. Each year, the Fund for the Arts raises more than \$8,000,000 from over 20,000 donors and supports Arts access, education and innovation throughout the region. Before joining the Fund for the Arts, Christen served in leadership roles for some of the country's most treasured cultural institutions and has raised nearly \$250 million for regional nonprofit organizations including Actors Theatre of Louisville, the High Museum of Art in Atlanta, Cincinnati's Fine Arts Fund, and The Parklands of Floyds Fork, one of the nation's largest new urban parks. She served as Director of the Greater Louisville Project and founded the Boone Group, coaching
