Presentation Title: "The Power of the Rotary Foundation"

Rotarians from all over the world donate funds to The Rotary Foundation. There are good reasons they do so. First, The Rotary Foundation has the highest possible rating from Charity Navigator, the largest and most-utilized charity rating organization in the world. Second, The Rotary Foundation enables Rotarians all over the world to perform wonders for those in need. Last year, The Rotary Foundation spent over \$260 million for maternal and child health, clean water, community economic development, disease prevention and cure, basic education and literacy, and peace and conflict resolution. Our part of the country, a fourteen-state area we call the Heart of America, has developed a partnership with a similar area in Mexico to help people in need in both of our countries. This program will highlight some of those great projects.

Beth Stubbs, our speaker, is the current District Rotary Foundation Chair for District 6780 in east Tennessee. Stubbs is CFO for Trinity Benefit Advisors in Knoxville, and has a private practice as well. Despite her busy practice, Stubbs accepted this role in Rotary because she has seen for herself some of the projects that Foundation dollars have made possible. She has seen the power of The Rotary Foundation and how every Rotarian can make a difference in the world.

November 21, 2018 - ROTARY MEETING RECAP



Our November 21st Rotary Club meeting featured Major Roy Williams, Louisville Area Commander for the Salvation Army. As Bill Weyland, the scheduled speaker, was unfortunately ill (hopefully feeling better and to be featured at a future meeting), Major Roy Williams of the Salvation Army stepped up at the last minute to provide the feature presentation for the annual Louisville Rotary Thanksgiving meeting co-hosted with the Kiwanis Club of Louisville. The Major, speaking from 27 years of experience with the Salvation Army, did an exemplary job of discussing and presenting their role in often being first responders at sites of natural disasters, providing desperately needed relief to survivors. Well familiar with the bell-ringing and Angel Tree projects of the Salvation Army, Rotarians

were amazed by the scale, speed and efficiency achieved by Salvation Army relief crews and mobile canteens, in response to disasters across 128 countries. Thirty million people are served in the U.S. every year, said Major Roy. "That's about 1 person every second," he said, and pointed out that relief efforts are largely funded by those bell-ringers.

As an example of a recent relief effort, the Major presented slides and statistics depicting relief efforts directly following Hurricane Harvey in 2017. Major Roy's crew of 9 people and 5 Mobile Canteens (like relief food trucks) were 1st responders in Beaumont, Texas, which was devastated by the hurricane. Providing hot meals to a two-mile-long line of traffic, the Major's crew was serving up to 16,000 meals per day for two weeks.

On the timely topic of the Angel Tree and bell ringing, Major Roy said 7,000 children are helped through the Angel Tree, again with the Salvation Army's amazing efficiency of serving 40 families every 15 minutes. The Major said their bell-ringing goal for this year is \$565,000, and encourages all Rotarians to give as well as to volunteer.

Major Roy's last-minute presentation turned out to be just right for a Thanksgiving message, much appreciated by the Rotarians and Kiwanians in attendance.
