Presentation Title: "The Before and Afters by Jon Carloftis"

Kentucky native Jon Carloftis is a great American gardener. His more than 25-year career in gardening began far from home in New York City where he has become one of America's pioneers in rooftop/small space gardening. As a 10th generation Kentuckian and graduate of the University of Kentucky, he recently moved home to Lexington and restored an 1851 home and garden, Botherum. A published author with books such as Beautiful Gardens of Kentucky, First A Garden and Beyond the Windowsill, Jon is a man of many talents.

Although he has built gardens for the likes of Julianne Moore, Edward Norton, Mike Myers, and even Google his approach is very simple: First, figure out the problems that need fixed (views, noise, privacy, etc.) and then work with the interior of the space to pull the same feeling outdoors for a seamless connection. From traditional to modern, all of the gardens are built for entertaining and enjoying the outdoors through good design and knowledge of plants.

In addition to private gardens and horse farms, Jon's work has transformed the hospitality and sense of welcome for some of the Commonwealth's most iconic spaces such as Summit at Fritz Farm in Lexington, Maker's Mark Distillery in Loretto, Castle & Key Distillery in Millville, Frazier History Museum, the Kentucky Governor's Mansion, University of Kentucky Kroger Field, and many more.

November 1, 2018 - ROTARY MEETING RECAP



Our November 1st Rotary Club meeting featured **Dr. Eddie Jones, CEO, Life Hope Center for a Safe Louisville.** Dr. Woods addressed Rotarians with his peace-driven topic of, "No More Red Dots: Violence Interruption in Louisville". Having received \$1.6 million in funding from Louisville Metro this fiscal year to implement a violence-interruption model of violence reduction through prevention, Dr. Woods discussed how this model is applied in a community, and specifically Louisville, to reduce violent crime. He said that current and potential offenders are most successfully dissuaded from continuing or pursuing violence as a lifestyle by

offering them choices of ways to earn money constructively and peacefully. "I ask them if them want to make money, and then explain that they make money with what they know, and then show them options for spending their time learning." Dr. Woods said he develops a database of potential offenders, working predominantly with gangs, and he focuses on giving them "other things to do." For kids who quickly get 'addicted to the bang,' (of a gun), he added that kids have be offered alternatives as early as possible, as they are quickly given access to guns at very young ages.

Steamed Broccoli Dinner Rolls Fresh Fruit Assorted Cakes and Pies Dr. woods encourages anyone interested to reach out to the LIFE hope center for opportunities to volunteer for, or donate to violence interruption. "There's lots of room for all of us to be involved in violence interruption," said Eddie. "Peace has to be a way of life. Nobody can afford to be a bystander."


