October 10, 2013 Rotary Meeting

Now which of the four men at the high table is the Retired Air Force General? This was the question on my mind as I began my lunch. I knew it was not past president Charles Oberst, but, to my surprise, it was one of the two younger men at the table. The other was Lukas Dwelly who was to introduce Brigadier General Givens. Yet, when he began to speak, and when he did stand at the podium, it was obvious that Brigadier General Robert Givens had the experience and knowledge to lead us through some of the delicate decisions being made at the highest level of our country's military leadership.

Charlie Oberst, President Randy's "substitute for the day", opened the meeting, calling on Terry Waddle for the appropriate Invocation. Once again we were favored by music from Ky. Opera artists, following David Roth's leading us in the Pledge of Allegiance. Danielle Messina sang "Juliette's Waltz" from "Romeo and Juliet", with such a powerful soprano voice that she really didn't need the PA system. In introducing the two birthdays --Rick Heath and Dade Luckett-- Paul Gold, another of the "Best we've ever had", pointed out that Dade has had perfect attendance for the last 23 years. Dr. Oberst then entertained the club with some amusing anecdotes from the maternity ER before turning the podium over to President Randy for the presentation of Paul Harris Fellowship awards to Phil Tamplin and Gail Becker. Phil and Gail have 25 years of Louisville Rotary membership between them, and each has given \$1,000 to the Rotary Foundation for Rotary International.

Lukas Dwelly then introduced our speaker, who had recently returned to his hometown of Louisville after retiring as a General following 30 years service as a command pilot in the U. S. Air Force. General Givens began by lamenting the government shutdown which adversely affects the readiness of our strategically deployed military resources around the world. He then proceeded to illustrate how sensitive our readiness to deal with international crises really is when anything throws off the careful balance of deployed forces. His talk described an incident in August of 2008 when he was Special Assistant for Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, Admiral Michael Mullen. Givens was in Mullens' office during a dead time between meetings when Vice Admiral Winnefeld, who at that time was Director of Strategy and Policy for the Joint Staff, came rushing in obviously very excited and said to Mullens, "Chairman, General Makarov, the Russian Chief of Defense, is on the phone and needs to speak to you urgently." General Makarov had called the Admiral to inform him that Russian offensive forces had taken action against the Republic of Georgia. Givens described some of the recommendations or "knee jerk reaction" of some of the top brass. Luckily, calmer heads prevailed, and we were able to slowly back away from what could have been a very nasty confrontation with the Russians. In closing, Givens spoke particularly of the strategic importance of South Korea, as "North Korea poses the greatest threat to world peace today." — David Reed


