Bryan is the national spokesman for Quantum Rehab, a division of Pride Mobility Corporation, and travels the country making numerous personal appearances while delivering his message of perseverance and determination in major rehab facilities. In addition, he is an Ambassador for the Gary Sinise Foundation and a USA Cares spokesman. USA Cares is a national nonprofit organization based in Radcliff, Kentucky focused on assisting post 911 veterans in times of need.

Bryan enlisted in the Army in April, 2001 and had a 'ship out' date of September 11, 2001. He served two tours of duty in Iraq, stationed in the Baghdad area. He attained the rank of Sergeant in the Military Police (MP), conducted police training courses in Iraq and gained additional law enforcement experience at Leavenworth Federal Penitentiary as a prison guard. In October 2005, Bryan was injured by an Improvised Explosive Device (IED) that resulted in the loss of

both legs and his left hand. As a result of his injuries, he was awarded a Purple Heart. Bryan received rehabilitation for a period of 13 months at Walter Reed Army Hospital. He is one of the few triple amputees to have survived his injuries in Iraq.

In addition to media coverage (USA Today, Esquire, 60 Minutes segment, etc.), Bryan has appeared in the HBO Documentary, *Alive Day Memories: Home from Iraq*, and in a CSI: NY episode titled *DOA for a DAY* as a murder suspect. He appeared in the Golden Globe Award winning film The Wrestler which was released in December 2008. Bryan was interviewed by MTV News 'Choose or Lose Street Team' and has appeared on the daytime drama 'All My Children.' He was the subject of the Captain America comic, 'Theater of War – to soldier on,' released in August 2009. Bryan has finished work on a book titled *No Turning Back*, released November 1, 2011, and most recently hosted a new PBS show, *Reporting for Service with Bryan Anderson*, which received an Emmy Award. He also received a Telly Award for his work on a Quantum Rehab product video titled 'Life Beyond Limits.'

Bryan is energetic and enthusiastic and enjoys challenging his limits. He snowboards, wake boards, white water rafts and rock climbs. He loves to travel and meeting new people. Bryan resides in the Chicago area. In addition to academic excellence, Bryan excelled in high school sports and competed as an accomplished gymnast in state level competitions. Following graduation, he worked for American Airlines as a Ground Crew Chief at O'Hare airport.

day evening's highly-praised walking tour and wine-tasting event. Past President Merrily next introduced Past President Henry Heuser, Jr. who introduced our own speaker, Maria Hampton.

Maria was appointed to Vision Louisville by Mayor Greg Fischer. Speaking for herself, Maria squeezed a six-hour presentation into thirty minutes. As understood by this Reporter, Maria described VL's strategy as summoning Louisville's established and emerging leaders, thinkers, doers and entrepreneurs to engagement and transformative action for the benefit of the community. VL seeks BIG IDEAS to re-imagine the City's future, build a FRAMEWORK to recruit "transformative" talent and investment, in support of QUALITY OF LIFE.

VL has three phases: Summer 2012, Summer 2013, and Fall-Spring 2013-2014. As part of VL's charge to develop "the Mother of All Plans," many of the City's long-standing imponderables and dilemmas will be brought into focus: How can we make west Louisville successful? Can SDF ever be integrated positively into the City's daily life and its neighborhoods? How to reap Fourth Street's potential? A virtual VL Town Meeting generated an explosion of ideas, 80,000 in all, that were communicated by and through traditional and non-traditional media. They ranged from the Google-esque "*Wi-Fi-ing of Louisville*," to "creating a downtown living room," and the whimsical, "rigging zip-lines over the Ohio River" (Wheee!). Another was "Grow and develop the City's immigrant talent," which could be a true vision of this community's future. - Stan Whetzel


