Report on 2015-16 District Grant Program By: Rick Harned

Last Rotary Year, Rotary Foundation Funds entrusted to our District as District Designated Funds (DDF) funded 37 projects submitted by 21 different member Rotary clubs. A total of \$75,496 was approved for grants to the clubs; of that, \$68,405 was distributed, as some projects were not completed or came in under budget.
