#### Presentation Title: "Trends in Corporate Philanthropy"

An unusually versatile musician, Teddy Abrams is the widely-acclaimed Music Director of the Louisville Orchestra and Music Director and Conductor of the Britt Festival Orchestra. A tireless advocate for the power of music, Abrams has fostered interdisciplinary collaborations with organizations including the Louisville Ballet, the Center for Interfaith Relations, Oregon Shakespeare Festival, the Speed Art Museum, and the Folger Shakespeare Library. His rap-opera, The Greatest: Muhammad Ali, premiered in 2017, celebrating Louisville's hometown hero with an

all-star cast that included Rhiannon Giddens and Jubilant Sykes.

Teddy makes his debut with the National Symphony Orchestra in the 2018-19 season in a program built around a commission by Lera Auerbach, and he appears with the Utah, Wichita, Eugene, and Elgin Symphonies. He celebrates Leonard Bernstein's centenary with an all-Bernstein program at the Kennedy Center on what would have been his 10th birthday. Recent guest conducting highlights include engagements with the Los Angeles Philharmonic; the San Francisco, Houston, Milwaukee, Vancouver, Colorado, and Phoenix Symphonies; Saint Paul Chamber Orchestra; and the Florida Orchestra. He has enjoyed a longstanding relationship with the Indianapolis Symphony, and recently conducted them with Time for Three for a special recorded for PBS. He served as Assistant Conductor of the Detroit Symphony from 2012-2014.

# October 11, 2018 - ROTARY MEETING RECAP



Our October 11th Rotary Club meeting featured **Conrad G. Bachmann, Executive Producer and Actor.** Conrad opened his presentation doing what he is globally prized for ... entertaining. Mr. Bachmann had his Rotarian audience engaged and laughing with his comical account of getting to the meeting that morning. Then he proceeded to regale us with anecdotes of television and film roles, as well as social encounters, with such other film stars as Rock Hudson, Bing Crosby, Charles Boyer, David Niven and Angela Lansbury. A particular memory of note was advice from Bing Crosby (for whom Mr. Bachmann was a double), suggesting ... "Never go for the lead. Go for the support roles. If the

movie goes to [expletive], the lead is out of work, and you go on to your next job." As Mr. Bachmann was in town for the \$\frac{1}{2}\text{0}\text{annual Louisville International Film Festival, and as Executive Director, he encouraged Rotarians to attend, and he summarized the body of work which is now drawing 30 to 40 countries in attendance and submission of films. The happiest news he delivered was that he and his wife, Kate, would be returning to Louisville for full-time residence, and to focus on the Festival which has gained global acclaim for introducing such hits as Winter's Bone.

Conrad announced that he is publishing a book, It Just Happened, which he says is perfectly
