**Ghislain d'Humieres, Director of Speed Art Museum**

**Topic: Art is Freedom / Speed Museum**

**Renovation and Spring 2016 Reopening**

A native of France, Ghislain d'Humieres studied at the Sorbonne in Paris, where he received his DEA in History and License of Art History. He became a specialist in 18<sup>th</sup> century furniture for Sotheby's London, and later transferred to Sotheby's in New York. To further his education, he studied at the Gemological Institute of America, and became the Director of the jewelry department at Christie's of Los Angeles, overseeing the West Coast and South America. During his employment, he gained extensive business knowledge, expanded his expertise, and traveled extensively around the World. In 2001, he transferred to Christie's in Geneva and was in charge of international clients from Europe and South America. A compassionate leader, d'Humieres took an eighteen-month sabbatical in Guatemala, during which time he worked with street children involved in drugs and prostitution. After his sabbatical, he founded the Alix Donation Fund (ADF) for underprivileged children in Guatemala. Shortly thereafter, he was hired by the Fine Arts Museum of San Francisco .... **Jackie Ford**, CEO of Girl Scouts of Kentuckiana, is a native of Chattanooga, Tennessee. Jackie came to Girl Scouts of Kentuckiana with over 25 years of professional nonprofit experience. Prior to joining the Girl Scout's executive staff, she served as Executive Director of Literacy Volunteers of America in Danbury, Connecticut for ten years with a mission to improve adult and family literacy. Over the years, Jacqueline has served on many nonprofit boards and in various volunteer roles. Due to her commitment to volunteerism, Jacqueline was appointed as State Commissioner for the Governor's Commission for National and Community Service while in Connecticut. In 1999 Jacqueline began her professional Girl Scout career. She joined the staff of Girls Scouts of Southwestern Connecticut as Director of Membership and Marketing working to improve member retention. She moved to Chief Operating Officer for this 15,000 member council in 2002. In 2005 Jacqueline accepted the position of Chief Executive Officer for the Girl Scout Council of Savannah, Georgia – the birthplace of Girl Scouts. 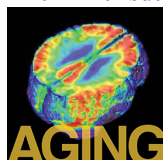
