Presentation Title: "No More Red Dots: Violence Interruption in Louisville"

Dr. Woods' work has received \$1.6 million in funding from Louisville Metro this fiscal year to implement the No More Red Dots/Cure Violence model as well as a partnership with the Mayor's Office of Safe and Healthy Neighborhoods. This public health approach to violence reduction was

profiled in a recent issue of The Rotarian highlighting:

The Cure Violence Model is an evidence-based approach and views violence like a preventable disease which can anticipate where violence may occur, reduce the risk of violence by intervening before it erupts, and change the community norms. Trained staff from the community prevents shootings and killings by detecting and interrupting lethal conflicts in the community and mediating them to a peaceful end. Workers help to change behaviors of community members by challenging their thinking on the use of violence, providing critical support, and connecting individuals with job opportunities and social services. Staff also works to shift community norms by organizing community activities and spread positive norm Multiple evaluation have shown the impact of the Cure Violence model in reducing shooting, violent confrontations and killings in multiple cities across the United States with reductions up to 70%. October 25, 2018 - ROTARY MEETING RECAP



Our October 25th Rotary Club meeting featured Dan Jones, Chairman and CEO, The Parklands of Floyds Fork. Dan began his overview and update of the Parklands' status and success with a reference to the legacy and inspiration for its development: "We set out to achieve another round of Olmsted," said Mr. Jones, referring to the development of Louisville's Olmsted parks in the 1890s by Frederick Law Olmsted, who previously developed New York City's Central Park in Manhattan. As it's easy to take these parks for granted a century later while we still enjoy them regularly, Mr. Jones made the point that it took Mr. Olmsted to foresee growth in expanding cities. "Parks are infrastructure," Mr. Jones said. "They need to be installed ahead of the

population growth. You can't retrofit a park," he cogently added. As too many cities around the world make the mistake of growing before securing and developing park space, and regretting the lack of it, Mr. Jones pointed to the benefit of a park already well-evidenced in the Parklands' 3,700 acres across a 20-mile corridor. Including the use of the popular 19.4 bike path which is designed to ultimately connect with Louisville's future 100-mile bike loop, Parklands has had 11 million visits total, with 3 million last year (the first full year), and was purchased with \$130 million of privately raised funding, with no tax dollars. The real value of Parklands to residents and visitors was demonstrated in Mr. Jones' images, letters, testimonials and images during his presentation – all

depicting a new treasure of nature's beauty, stunning but complementary architecture, and vast opportunity of green space for natural activity and enjoyment.
