Partnering for Peace fosters partnerships between Rotary International and the global Peace Corps community through ongoing networking, technical support and fellowship. It seeks to implement this mission through a variety of efforts:

- 1. Request that Rotary Districts identify all of their international projects, to share with their liaison to the Peace Corps.
- 2. Connect Peace Corps Volunteer recruits with a Rotary club to foster mentoring and support while the PCV is in-county.
- 3. Match Returned Peace Corps Volunteers (RPCVs) with their local Rotary District to seek partnering opportunities.
- 4. Include Rotary and Rotaract members in meeting with outbound PCVs and their families.
- 5. Maintain a formal partnership between the US Peace Corps and Rotary International.
- 6. Establish formal partnerships with other international service volunteer organizations.

Earth Month Cleanup Event - Saturday, April 23, 2022

Join us on Saturday, April 23, 2022 from 9:00 am - noon as we team up with Kentucky Waterways Alliance for a Storm Drain Marking Volunteer Project in Crescent Hill in celebration of Earth Month 2022. Volunteers will affix curb stickers to storm drains on Frankfort Avenue and surrounding residential streets to alert citizens that items entering the drains empty directly into Beargrass Creek, which drains to the Ohio River. Materials such as street litter, oil, grass clippings, pet waste, chemicals, fertilizers, and other pollutants that enter the drain untreated end up polluting our waterways.

Volunteers will meet at the KWA/Rotary table at the St. Mark's Episcopal Church parking lot, 2822 Frankfort Ave (we have permission to park in the church parking lot). There will be a brief introduction, welcome, educational info about the project, safety talk, then teams will be assembled and given maps and supplies.

This service project is born out of "Saving Our Rivers" - a five year partnership with KWW to improve one of Kentucky's greatest natural resources - our waterways. It aligns with Rotary International's global commitment to environmental issues that

include preserving biodiversity by protecting and restoring habitats, conserving native species, removing invasive plant and animal species, conserving, and protecting endangered species as well as supporting initiatives to improve aquifer and groundwater recharging, water conservation, water quality, sanitation, and watershed management.

Applications For Rotary Peace Fellowships Due May 15

It's that exciting time of the year again when applications are now open for Rotary Peace Fellowships! These unique fellowships are an integral part of Rotary's worldwide support for peace and reconciliation efforts. Each year, the Rotary Foundation, in cooperation with local districts and clubs, awards 80 all-expenses paid fellowships for a three-month certificate program and 50 additional fellowships for Master's Degree programs. The certificate program is conducted in Bangkok, Thailand, and the Master's

Degree program is conducted at eight separate universities around the world.

Applicants must submit an application directly to the Rotary Foundation by **May 15**. The District's Peace Fellows Subcommittee interviews the applicant and submits an endorsement to Rotary by **July 1**.

Please spread the word to possible candidates. Candidates for the 90-day certificate program must have a strong academic background plus five years of full-time related work experience. Candidates for the Master's Degree program must have a bachelor's degree plus three years of related work experience.

As a Rotarian, you support this wonderful program through your dues and contributions. Although not well-known, the program is a substantial contribution to world peace. It is one way that no matter what your occupation or geographic location you contribute to efforts to reduce conflict and spilled blood in our contentious times.
