

If you want an update on our Club's Service Projects and Grants, please plan to stay after the meeting for about 45 minutes for our next session of Rotary University.



With these often unexpected weather events causing such devastation at an unprecedented pace, we need a new approach and collaborative solutions to redesign the recovery process with technology, efficiency, and empathy so we can empower communities to rebuild resiliently after natural disaster.



This home will be built in Eastern Jefferson County near the Ford plant between Westport Road and KY 22 (Ballardsville Rd.) Our fellow club member **Jeremy Vokurka**, Director of Operations for Miranda Construction, will be organizing members of his work crew, skilled and otherwise, to help with the Raise the Roof work on **Friday, May 19 from 8:30 to 3:30**. We will need a few Rotarian volunteers that day to join his group.



Abbas Algburi and Iman Mns, married, ages 37 and 33, from Iraq. They have a 4-year-old boy and a 3-year-old daughter. He works as a caregiver at Access Care. They've recently moved from an apartment in Beuchel to a house in Fern Creek.

We are planning with Habitat on two additional days for volunteers, the first of which will be for installing siding and the second for landscaping (planting shrubs and spreading topsoil for sod). When those dates are firmed up I will be sending out another email.
