#### IN MEMORIAM: J. Michael Ehrler



J. Michael (Mike) Ehrler, 99, of Louisville, passed away on September 1, 2022, after a long, full life. He joined Rotary in January 1967 - over 55 years ago!

Raised on a dairy farm in Louisville, Mike and his brothers expanded the small family milk-processing operation - Ehrler's Dairy, a favorite local business - to include home delivery service and 13 retail stores, which sold ice cream, delicious candy, and a variety of dairy products. Mike flew both B-17 and B-29 aircraft in World War II and later flew small planes from Bowman Field. Mike became the first licensed hot air balloon pilot in the state of Kentucky and flew them for 41 years which resulted in lifelong friends, extensive travel, and competitive ballooning, with many victories.

We will still issue tickets for the buffet line, so you can register without purchasing a meal if you prefer. ## Wealth Gap Simulation at Second Presbyterian - September 22, 11am-1pm

We are excited to team up with Metro United Way to host the <u>Wealth Gap Simulation</u> in place of our regular meeting on September 22nd. Rotarian Steve Jester will be hosting us at Second Presbyterian on Brownsboro Rd. This will be a longer than normal meeting, from 11:00am until 1:00pm - please feel free to arrive at 10:30am for networking. More than 3,000 individuals have participated in this simulation that takes people and organizations on a historical journey to wealth building in America, pausing on 13 federal policies that most powerfully accelerated or impeded progress based on race. It is helpful in understanding the impact of laws that have determined access to opportunity, resources, and power for generations, and highlights what we can do to change them. In partnership with Bread for the World, Metro United Way developed this training in the fall of 2019 and trained its staff to execute the simulation and offer a safe, confidential and engaging space to help elevate the conversation around policies that have been in place for decades that have affected generations of families in our community.


