

To mark the 50th anniversary of the Clean Water Act, Rotary Fund President Jean West will be presenting the "big check" to Kentucky Waterways Alliance at a media event on the **Great Lawn at noon on Tuesday**, **October 18th**. The check represents our \$3,000 grant, which aligns with Rotary International's global commitment to environmental issues, including supporting initiatives to improve aquifer and groundwater recharging, water conservation, water quality, sanitation, and watershed management.

A NEW PROGRAM BY THE ROTARY CLUB OF LOUISVILLE BRINGS EQUITY AND DIVERSITY TO THE HOME LOAN AND BUYING PROCESS. JEAN WEST REPORTS.

t was the summer of 2020. Louisville, like much of the country was ablaze in social unrest, protests and calls for justice in the killing of Breonna Taylor, whose senseless murder by Louisville police became a national symbol of racial profiling, inequity, and hopelessness.

The Rotary Club of Louisville, a 110-yearold nonprofit organization of successful business and civic leaders was already on a trajectory to embrace change– having elected me as the first African American President Elect in 2019. The summer of 2020 accelerated that change. It had been designated a year of "connecting our community," the theme set by 2020 President, Luke Schmidt who had hoped to start building bridges within our city with a new Community Impact Committee (CIC). The committee had just gotten started, cleaning up graffiti on expressway signs, when Covid hit and slowed everything to a halt.

The tragic Breonna Taylor shooting snapped everyone to attention. "Members of the club, like all citizens, were distressed with what was happening," says Schmidt. "I received a lot of calls and emails from members, asking, 'What can we do?" The first step in formulating an action plan, he decided, was to educate the club's members. "We agreed to convene two full-day working sessions," he says. "We had the president of the Kentucky NAACP, retired officers from LMPD, a judge from the KY Court of Appeals, community activists, education leaders... We stayed connected for an entire two days on Zoom that August."

One of the most compelling presentations was by former Police Chief Yvette Gentry. "She had two grandfathers who fought in WW II," says Denise Sears, chair of CIC's Policies and Justice Subcommittee. "Her white grandfather was able to access VA loans to purchase a home—beginning the wealth building for that side of the family. Her Black grandfather, however, did not have access to mortgage programs for veterans. He was never able build wealth to pass onto his heirs. He was still a tenant when he died."

Lack of generational wealth was a theme that was threaded through the entire two days- and lack of home ownership was the biggest obstacle. "We learned that approximately 80% of West Louisville residents are renters and are often unable to qualify for conventional mortgages," says Schmidt. "This is partly due to the lingering impact of redlining. More importantly, we learned that renters often pay monthly rent which is two to three times what they would be paying for a mortgage payment." Those Zoom sessions were the genesis of the Rotary Club of Louisville's West Louisville Housing Initiative.

The team went to work right away raising more than a million dollars in pledges, with the Rotary Club of Louisville committing \$5 million dollars to provide the first-round of capital for 30-year mortgages to 60 to 65 first-time homebuyers in West Louisville. "This program, which will be administered by our fiduciary partner Park Community Credit Union, will evaluate each application using alternative or non-traditional credit as needed," says Sears. "This will ensure that buyers who have a demonstrated ability to pay a mortgage are not locked out of homeownership. "WesBanco Bank and Fifth Third Bank are also partners in the program.

"In 2022 we are committing \$100,000," says Kim Halbauer, a Rotarian and President of Fifth Third Bank. "Our goal is to contribute \$500,000 total." Last October, Fifth Third also unrolled its national Empowering Black Futures Neighborhood Program. "One of our key goals with the Empowering Black Futures Neighborhood Program is to increase African American homeownership in a sustainable way that provides an opportunity for intergenerational wealth transfer," she says.

The work is just beginning, but the hope is that these local initiatives will become part of a bigger movement. "I want to see every bank and corporation in Louisville invest in this program which will transform West Louisville from a landlord tract to a homeowner community," says Halbauer. "I want our project to demonstrate its effectiveness at expanding homeownership in West Louisville, leading other cities to follow our model and, ultimately, eliminate racial bias in our federal banking regulations so programs like this won't be needed anymore."
