July 2, 2015 Rotary Meeting Recap

We met in the Waterford Room for Greg Braun's first meeting as Club President ...

The Rotary Club of Louisville meeting of May 21, 2015 was called to order by President Greg Braun, who presided over his first meeting as Club President for the 2015 – 2106 fiscal year. The invocation was provided by Henry Heuser Jr. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mark Wourms, who also led the Club's members in recitation of the Rotary Four Way



Test. Various guests were introduced. Penny Gold introduced the celebrants at the birthday table (ten Club members celebrated birthdays this week).

President Greg made several announcements. Next week's speaker, David Phemister is the State Director of the Kentucky Chapter of Nature Conservancy. President Greg also recognized several Club members during a new meeting segment called "Shout Outs" for having been mentioned/featured in various articles during the past week. Members recognized included: Rene Brown, Randy Coe, Tony Coffey, Kevin Lynch and Todd Spencer. A reminder was given about the upcomileghind the Scenes Tour & Dinner at the Louisville Zoo on July 15. President Greg then provided an overview of the Club's direction over the next year by highlighting the Club's Mission, Vision and, Three Strategic Pillars. These Pillars will serve as a strategic guide for the Club as we move forward. The Pillars include: (1) Engagement; (2) New Members; and, (3) Service. All members were encouraged to become active participants in the Club's activities.

Lukas Dwelly then introduced our speaker, Rebecca Matheny, who is the Executive Director of the Louisville Downtown Partnership (LDP). The Downtown Partnership also includes the Louisville Downtown Development Corporation and the Louisville Downtown Management District as part of its portfolio.

LDP's Mission is to aid in the facilitation and strengthening of commerce, provide maintenance assistance, beautify and enhance streetscapes, improve security and safety, and stimulate high quality development and vitality in Louisville's Downtown. Rebecca reminded our audience that Downtown Louisville is the state's "largest office park," with over 70,000 workers employed in the downtown area.

The Louisville Downtown Management District is an entity which is supported by an additional fee paid by downtown property owners and is charged with keeping the area clean and safe. This is supported by a group of Ambassadors who are readily visible on the street and are here to help both visitors and property owners. Economic development is a key part of the LDP's everyday activities and the group is constantly looking for ways to bring quality development into the area.

Other key projects include: (1) Fourth Street Streetscape; (2) NuLu Streetscape Project;

and, (3) the Whiskey Row Streetscape Project. Significant emphasis is being placed on the evolving Bourbon District, which will bring even more people (residents and tourists) to downtown. Including the Ohio River Bridges Project, at present, over \$1.95 billion in projects are underway in Downtown Louisville.
