Robert L. King became the third president of the Kentucky Council on Postsecondary Education in January 2009. Mr. King is the former Chancellor of the State University of New York, one of the largest comprehensive systems of universities, colleges, and community colleges in the world. More recently, he served as president and CEO of the Arizona Community Foundation, a statewide charitable foundation with a strong focus on education, economic development, and scientific research.

Mr. King is very active in community service and has volunteered and served on numerous boards and organizations. He has served for nine years on the White House Commission on Presidential Scholars; the Education Committee of the U.S. National Commission for the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization

(UNESCO); as advisor to the Middle State Commission on Higher Education regarding reauthorization of the Higher Education Act in Congress; the board of directors of the National Soccer Hall of Fame; and the boards of trustees of A.T. Still University, a specialized university dedicated to training professionals for the health care professions, in Kirksville, Missouri, and Mesa, Arizona, and Prescott College located in Prescott, Arizona.

Mr. King received a bachelor of arts degree in 1968 from Trinity College in Hartford, Connecticut, and a Juris Doctor in 1971 from the Vanderbilt University School of Law. He is married to Karen, his wife of 35 years, and they have four grown children.

David Hinton and the 4-Way Best combo saluted our speaker with an amazing rendition of James Brown's *I Feel Good*. Cyndi Caudill introduced birthday celebrants, and President Stuart gave shout-outs to ten Rotarians publicly caught in the act of doing good things in our community. Stuart highlighted SPARKS of 1915-1917 (Click **HERE**) and, in what *must* be a first, Emily Hart introduced a new member, her father, David James of Humana.

Speaker LaQuandra S. Nesbitt, MD, MPH, Director of Metro Louisville's Dept. of Public Health & Wellness, wowed us with a snapshot of our health status, and the expanding view of what public health can do to improve it. Louisville is not the healthiest community in Kentucky. One in three adults here is overweight or obese, and 25% of our adults still use tobacco products. The result: Louisville Metro's death rates for heart disease, cancer, diabetes and stroke are higher than those for Kentucky and the nation. You can see the full 2012 report by clicking **HERE**.

Despite our resources, we rank 118 out of 120 KY counties in "social determinants of health." Dr. Nesbitt said if you get sick, "Louisville is the place to be; we have fantastic doctors and hospitals. But we know that only 20% of a population's health status

is determined by the clinical care we receive." We choose 30% more with our own health behaviors: tobacco use, diet & exercise, alcohol use and unsafe sex. Our physical environment affects another ten percent. The biggest share of our health, 40%, is influenced by social and economic factors not traditionally thought of as health-related: educational attainment, employment level, income, family and social support.

For this reason the "Health Department" is thinking outside the box to set priorities that will have the largest impact in improving Louisville's health. These include creating a culture of health and wellness in Metro Louisville while we address the broader social challenges. She invited Rotarians to participate in the Mayor's Healthy Hometown Movement. To learn more, go to: www.louisvilleky.gov/health/. Given this expanding view of public

health, Dr. Nesbitt was visibly gratified—and Rotarians felt right on target—when President Stuart announced our contribution in her honor to the Rotary Promise Scholarship Fund.
