Mark has served as general manager of Kentucky Speedway, since it was acquired by Speedway Motorsports, Inc. in 2009. Prior to that acquisition, Mark served as president of the Speedway and has played an integral role in the facility's site selection, planning, development, financing and operations.

Since the SMI acquisition, Mark has overseen major additions to the facility, including 40,000 additional seats, thousands of camping spots, and significant infrastructure expansion. On July 9, 2011, Kentucky Speedway made history by hosting its first NASCAR Sprint Cup series race, the "Quaker State 400". This is the first major league sports franchise to ever locate in Kentucky. Kentucky Speedway is also the region and state's largest sports venue by seating and acreage.

Mark and his wife, Lori, live in Edgewood, Kentucky, and have five children.
