Dr. Rand Paul is the junior United States Senator for Kentucky. He is the son of Republican Congressman and former presidential candidate Ron Paul of Texas.

A graduate of Duke University School of Medicine, Paul has been a practicing ophthalmologist in Bowling Green, Ky., for 17 years. In 1995, he founded the Southern Kentucky Lions Eye Clinic, an organization that provides eye exams and surgery to needy families and individuals. Today, even as a U.S. Senator, Dr. Paul continues to provide pro-bono eye surgery to Kentuckians in need of care.

In the Senate, Paul serves on the Energy and Natural Resources, Health, Education, Labor and Pensions, Homeland Security and Government Affairs, and Small Business Committees. Paul's first legislative proposal was to cut \$500 billion from federal spending and balance the federal budget in just one year. He is a champion of fiscal responsibility, a fighter against government overreach, and a warrior for protecting our constitutional liberties.

Senator Paul has been a vocal advocate for term limits, a balanced-budget amendment, a Read the Bills Act, and an audit of the Federal Reserve. He has gained prominence for his independent positions on many political issues.

He is the author of The Tea Party Goes to Washington (February 2011). Paul has been married for 19 years and has three sons. Senator Paul's website is www.paul.senate.gov. Stuart thanked the volunteers who assisted at the Patriot Games and those who participated in the Public Radio Partnership fund drive. Tom Bohnert, Chair of the Investments Committee, gave a quarterly report on the excellent 11.5% return for the fund in 2012. Susan Smith introduced our newest member, Nancy Jo Trafton, Market Development Director for Courier-Journal Media.

Barbara Sexton Smith introduced our guest speaker, Mark Hogg, CEO and founder of

WaterStep. The organization was originally named Edge Outreach, and is headquartered here in Louisville. Mark shared his vision to provide solutions to the causes of water-borne illnesses across the globe. Bad water is the greatest killer of people across the world. WaterStep provides technology and training to help people, towns and villages treat their water using chlorine generators. The system uses electrolysis and can generate 55 gallons per minute of clean, safe water. Mark and his team are developing partnerships with organizations like Rotary and have already worked in 30 countries, including Haiti and Costa Rica, in response to devastating earthquakes. In Malawi, Africa, three people from Louisville have taken the WaterStep program to that very desperate nation. Mark closed with an impressive vision. He sees an opportunity for Louisville to become the "Water Capitol of the World", based on our indigenous knowledge and technology base. As a big step towards that goal, WaterStep is working to bring an International Water Symposium to Louisville. He invited the Club to get involved and become a major factor in driving this exciting and critically important program forward.

#### STRATEGIC PLANNING AT 100? Bring on the green bananas!

Did you hear about the octogenarian who quickly rejected a long-term financial investment offer saying, "No thanks! At my age I don't even buy green bananas!"

Well, this past July our Club celebrated an enviable 100 year milestone and just months earlier, President Stetten launched a long-term, strategic planning process - our Club's first in 25 years. *Bring on the green bananas*!

Why does a successful, centenarian Rotary Club need a strategic planning process? Financial advisors often say, "Past performance is no guarantee of future results." Times are rapidly changing and change brings greater risks and uncertainty, and also opportunities.

As a result, the Club has adopted a continuing **Strategic Planning Process** that will: (1) Keep the Club effectively focused on its core vision and mission from year to year; (2) Encourage best use of limited financial resources as well as the time and energy of our members; (3) Empower officers and committee leadership to be at their best; (4) Ensure the Club remains relevant and meets the needs of a changing community and world; and (5) Build collaboration among committees and their members.

In the beginning: Last March, President Stetten appointed an ad hoc planning group of Rotarians who are professional consultant-advisors: Ken Middleton, Kevin Connelly, Karen Dahlem and Dennis Dolan. They were asked to develop a strategic planning process to meet the Club's unique needs. That process began with development of a Vision Statement and Mission Statement. Read them HERE.

We completed the "trifecta" foundation of sound strategic planning by adding Rotary International's **Core Values & Guiding Principles**: Service, Fellowship, Diversity, Integrity, and Leadership. View **HERE**.

And then? Goals and objectives were then developed to address three strategic areas defined by RI: (1) Club Development & Effectiveness; (2) Sustainable Humanitarian Services; (3) Enhanced Public Awareness & Image.

These were formulated with the help of a broad range of Rotarians. To start, a "SWOT" (<u>Strengths, Weaknesses</u>,

<u>Opportunities</u>, <u>Threats</u>) membership survey provided invaluable guidance in identifying ten critical Goals areas. View survey results **HERE**. A subsequent half-day planning workshop in June, attended by over three dozen club leaders, identified 50 specific objectives linked to each of the ten Goals areas. After the workshop, a draft of the Strategic Plan was presented to the Board for review/approval. In September, more than 50 officers, directors and committee leaders met in a second workshop to develop tactical Action Plans to achieve these objectives.

Now what? These Action Plans are now being refined even as work begins. The Board and members will receive quarterly progress reports. To ensure the effectiveness and continuity of planning efforts, last June the Board established a <a href="Strategic Planning Committee">Strategic Planning Committee</a> (SPC) chaired by President-elect Randy Coe and co-chaired by Past President Stetten. Its role: (1) Manage a process for reviewing and refreshing the Club's Strategic Plan; (2) Serve as an ongoing advisory resource for the Board and Committees for developing and implementing the Strategic Plan within the framework of the Club's Mission, Vision and Values; and (3) Report quarterly to the Board on progress in achieving the Strategic Plan.
