Congressman John Yarmuth represents Kentucky's 3rd Congressional District in the U.S. House of Representatives. In his third term, he was selected to the Committee on Budget, the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform, and the Committee on Ethics.

In Congress, Yarmuth has fought for better quality and access in education and health care, while working to help small businesses compete in a global economy and expand individual opportunities for success. He helped enact the largest funding increase for veterans' health care in American history, supported a new GI Bill that guarantees a four-year education for our veterans, and secured \$75 million to build our new VA Hospital. He partnered with Ford and GE to revitalize

manufacturing in Louisville and create thousands of local jobs. And, Yarmuth has been named Best of Congress by Working Mother magazine in each of his three terms in Congress.

Before Louisville elected him to Congress, Yarmuth worked in education and health care, founded and ran successful small businesses, including LEO, Louisville's free newsweekly. He's a Louisville native, Atherton alum, father to Aaron, and 30-year husband to Cathy.



Jerry Greenwell, member of Frost Brown Todd, introduced Glenn Price, our club's newest Rotarian that you need to meet. Glenn is a member of **Frost Brown Todd**, a published author, adjunct professor at U of L Law School and a musician. Glenn's law practice focuses in zoning and land use and he is sure to keep us rockin' and rollin'.

Nancy Jo Trafton, market development director of Courier-Journal Media, introduced Wes Jackson, a Louisville native and the newest publisher and president of the **Courier-Journal**. Wes gave us an update on the operations of Kentucky's largest newspaper which reaches a half million people each day and 600,000 on Sundays. He conducted a survey of our media usage and asked for a raise of hands if we have a Facebook account (*most*), Twitter account (*quite a few*), obtain media online (*most*) or through an iPad or smart phone (*most*).

Wes discussed the challenges and opportunities of the rapidly changing media landscape for both his business and ours and indicated research shows people are consuming more media than ever before (e.g. 67,000 people per day access the CJ's content on their iPhone). Quantity and quality are two very different things and the Courier Journal believes it originates more credible local content than any other source. Wes mentioned some recent in-depth, investigative stories: Kentucky's broken tax system, child abuse and neglect in the Commonwealth and Kentucky's prescription drug epidemic as the type of credible journalism to expect from the CJ. Mindful some of us have stopped our subscriptions, he asked us to give the CJ a second look and to consider Courier-Journal Media for our business marketing needs.

President Stuart presented a certificate to Wes Jackson designating a contribution in his honor from the Rotary Club of Louisville to the Rotary Promise Scholarship Fund. - Chris Padgett


