Colonel Bruce Jenkins, who will be introduced by Heather Whelan at Thursday's meeting, is the commander of the U.S. Army Garrison at Fort Knox, Kentucky. He is responsible for all installation management functions, to include infrastructure maintenance and improvement, environmental stewardship, force protection, and leisure/well-being programs.

He was designated a distinguished military graduate and commissioned into the Adjutant General's Corps in 1986. He has earned three master's degrees (Business Administration, Lean 6 Sigma and Strategic Studies). Colonel Jen-

kins has served in key leadership positions of increasing responsibility in the U.S. Army. As a company grade officer, he commanded Alpha Company, Support Battalion, 1st Special Warfare Training Group (Airborne) and the Vancouver Recruiting Company, Portland Recruiting Battalion. As a field grade officer, he served as the Assistant Chief of Staff G1/AG, 82d Airborne Division and commanded the 556th Personnel Services Battalion while in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom.

Colonel Jenkins is married to the former Susan Young of Attleboro, Massachusetts, and they have a son, Bryce, a senior at Idaho State University and a daughter, Summer, a sophomore at the University of Hawaii.

President Stuart welcomed guests, recognized birthday celebrants and acknowledged Gary Ulmer, president of the Louisville Baseball Club, Inc., for the Business First cover article profiling the 30-year anniversary of minor league baseball in Louisville.

President-Elect Randy Coe introduced Sam Swope, the newest member to join our club. Sam is founder of Kentucky's largest automobile dealer, Sam Swope Auto Group (http://www.samswope.com) and is a Louisvillian of the Year past recipient.

President Stuart presented a framed article from the Courier-Journal profiling the Rotary Promise Scholarship to Past President Stet Stetten in honor of his work during his year and for the considerable publicity this program has brought to the club.

President Stuart shared a video from the Western High School launch of the Rotary Promise Scholarship. Tony Newberry, president of Jefferson Community and Technical College, introduced Robert L. King, president of the Kentucky Council on Postsecondary Education (http://cpe.ky.gov).

The Council is the chief champion for higher education in Kentucky. The Council focuses efforts on four key areas: college readiness, student success, efficiency and innovation, and research, economic and community development.

Robert shared insights from Gallup's survey that forecasts 3 billion people expecting a job that pays a living wage while only 1.2 billion jobs will be available. This gap highlights the importance of creating a workforce culture in Kentucky that is more productive and better at creative problem solving than anywhere else on earth.

Recessionary budget cuts in Frankfort took \$300 million away from education institutions and reduced the Kentucky allocation per pupil by \$700 million.

Kentucky is making progress and education reforms are working. A recent national study found Kentucky is making progress faster than most states. In 2010, Kentucky became the first state to adopt common core standards in language and math. President Stuart presented a certificate to Robert King signifying a contribution to the Rotary Promise Scholarship Fund being made in King's honor. - Chris Padaett
