

Guest Speaker: Mark K. Wourms, Ph.D. Executive Director of Bernheim Arboretum & Research Forest

Mark Wourms has been Executive Director of Bernheim Arboretum and Research Forest since July of 2008, after serving as Chief Executive Officer of the Los Angeles Arboretum and Botanic Garden and, before that, as the director of the Kansas City Zoo, where he rebuilt the entire zoo. Mark supervises a management team for 14,595 acres of arboretum and natural areas at Bernheim, where his focus is on ecological research, regenerative design, community education and outreach. Mark initiated and completed a strategic plan process which resulted in a new vision, mission and plan with four big ideas which will direct their actions for the next ten years. He has formed strategic partnerships to develop and implement educational programs and special events for approximately 210,000 visitors each year.

As one C-J reporter stated: "It would be difficult to find a more enthusiastic and passionate advocate for nature and its connections to human beings than Mark. He brings a lifetime exploring those connections—from Peace Corps volunteer in Benin to stints at the Bronx and Kansas City zoos to CEO of the Los Angeles Arboretum Foundation, to his present job at Bernheim."

Bernhiem Forest is not new to "green" projects. Their Visitor's Center was the first platinum, LEED Certified (green) building in Kentucky. LEED certification provides independent, third-party verification that a building project is environmentally responsible, profitable and a healthy place to live or work. Dr. Wourms commented, "Green roofs are the future. We believe that just in a few years it's going be standard practice to build green roofs on buildings, garages and factories, and it's happening all across the United States and the world. Bernheim has a chance to show people in this area how to do it well and make great choices with the plants."

Mark earned his B.S. in botany at Ohio University and his Ph.D. in ecology and animal behavior at Boston University. He and his wife and two children make their home in Louisville.






