

Gill Holland is a Norwegian-American Spirit Award-nominated film producer and developer of The Green Building in Louisville, KY. Holland grew up in North Carolina and has produced more than 50 feature films. Holland founded cineBLAST! which the Hollywood Reporter in 1999 and 2000 called one of the top ten production companies in New York City. He sold cineBLAST! in 2000 at the height of the tech boom. Gill is also the founder of sonaBLAST! Records, an independent record label whose 2004 release Ghosts turned gold and received critical acclaim in Ireland and the USA.

Together with his wife, Augusta Brown Holland, Gill developed The Green Building. This renovation of a historic building opened in the Fall of 2008 in NuLu aka the East Market District, the heart of Louisville's arts district. It

provides offices for SonaBLAST! Records, Holland Brown Books and The Group Entertainment. They then went on to landmark and develop almost a block of neighboring historic buildings. *Louisville Magazine* named Gill its 2009 Person of the Year. He is also the author of two fundraising art books for children.

In 2013, he turned his attention to the Portland neighborhood in Louisville's West End and is opening the Compassion Building and working on rehabilitating 100 historic shotgun houses. Board and commission service includes Actors Theatre of Louisville, Louisville Film Society, Fund for the Arts, Speed Art Museum, Olmsted Parks Conservancy, Louisville Public Media, Kentucky Film Commission, KY Governor's School for the Arts Advisory Council, International Bluegrass Music Museum.

Gill is a University of Carolina graduate and former attorney. He and his wife, Augusta, have three children, Cora, Owsley and Lilla.





# September 12, 2013 Rotary Meeting

With President Randy out of town, 1999-2000 President Bos Todd rang the bell to open the meeting, Kathy Evitts gave the invocation, Bob Slider led the Pledge and introduced UofL School of Music faculty member Daniel Weeks, whose tenor soared *Amazing Grace*, and accompanist Naomi Oliphant. Larry Sloan toasted our birthday celebrants.

Henry Heuser introduced an alumni gathering of his "Henry's Heroes." Bos saved valuable speaker time by presenting the list of event announcements on screen before recognizing Rotarians with 15, 20 and 40 years of service.



Tony Newberry announced the University of Louisville has committed that each Rotary Promise Scholarship recipient who achieves an associate degree at JCTC

in turn will receive \$10,000 toward completing a 4-year degree at UofL—exciting news indeed! Sophomores at Western High School already are highly motivated, with behavior problems down, attendance and academic achievement up. Tony recognized President Jim Ramsey and Director of Admissions Jenny Sawyer for their role in this profound expan-

Bill Rothwell's introduction cited 16 years of unparalleled achievements by speaker Tom Jurich, VP and Director of Athletics at UofL. Jurich acknowledged it's been a good year, but immediately focused on how to get better. "I want the Years of the Cards," and like the old TV show The Jeffersons, "We're Movin' on Up."

Jurich said UofL recruits the best athletes with an eye to character first and talent second. He called the athletic program a family of 1,000, with remarkable fighting spirit throughout its 286 staff, coaches and administrators and 780 student athletes. We were the biggest (16.5-pt.) underdog to ever win a BCS bowl. He called Coach Charlie Strong "an incredible man, and a true treasure for this community."

He said the athletic dept. works closely with the UofL faculty, and getting into the Atlantic Coast Conference will bring us academic riches and new levels of competition. He appreciated eight great years in the Big East, with television revenues that solidified us on the national platform." Meanwhile, the AAC has been dealt a tough hand this year, "but we want to take the high road. We're taking Maryland's place in the ACC, and we have nowhere to play until they leave." Adding to that anticipation is a 2014 football game against Notre Dame at South Bend, 2017 here and 2020 away.


