

Todd Hollenbach is the 40th State Treasurer of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. He was first elected in 2007 and reelected in 2011. He has a distinguished record of public service that includes his position as a Commissioner with the Kentucky Commission on Human Rights. As a Commissioner, Hollenbach worked diligently to ensure that the rights of all Kentuckians were protected regardless of race, religion, age or gender. His reputation for fair dealing and hard work earned him a position on the bipartisan Blue Ribbon Commission convened to investigate the Merit Hiring System.

As Treasurer, Todd is working to streamline internal accounting procedures, modernize office technology, improve customer service, promote transparency in government, financial literacy and the creation of the Treasurer Finders program. In addition, Todd is developing legislative and educational initiatives to better prepare

Kentucky to safeguard their own financial interests. He has followed in the Hollenbach family tradition of public service. His grandmother, Winky, was one of the first women in Kentucky to seek high elected office. His father, Todd Hollenbach, Sr., was a longtime Jefferson County Judge Executive and Commonwealth Attorney.

The State Treasurer serves as custodian of all property surrendered to the state that is presumed lost or abandoned. Each year, the Kentucky Treasury returns millions of dollars in unclaimed property to Kentucky residents. Since 2008, under the proactive leadership of Treasurer Hollenbach and his Treasure Finder's Program, the Treasury has returned a record amount of more than \$91 million. In fact, Hollenbach's administration has returned almost one quarter of the money that Kentucky has returned in the history of the Unclaimed Property Program.

Todd graduated from the University of Kentucky in 1982 and earned a law degree from the University of Louisville in 1985. Todd is a native of Jefferson County where he resides with his wife, Rosemarie, and their two sons, Jacob and Reiss.




September 26, 2013 Rotary Meeting

Karen Morrison opened our meeting with a nature-oriented invocation, David Hinton led the Pledge and singing, and Steve Lennon introduced celebrants, including Marie Humphries on her 94th birthday!

2007-2008 Past President James U. Smith, III was Randy's guest presider, and he welcomed visiting Rotarians from Omaha and Anchorage, Alaska. Jim compared becoming past president, with death, in that it happens suddenly, comes at the wrong time, but unlike death, there's no afterlife. Jim started the meeting early enough that our speaker was introduced on time, despite five big announcements indicating the scope of our activities and community impact.

Dick Brien called for volunteers for the Middle School Connection. Gary Noel teed up the Oct. 7 Golf Scramble, and Greg Braun likewise for the UofL Tailgating party on Oct. 10. Mitch Rue reported we are halfway to launching our second Rotary Promise Scholarship program, at Iroquois High School, if we raise

\$250,000 by April. Meanwhile, Mitch is recruiting ten Rotary mentors each for Iroquois and Western, to help students who fall short of requirements in their first high school semester. He said six students are at the District Rotary Youth Leadership Academy, and they will be the future leaders of the schools' Interact Clubs.

Phil Tamplin introduced guest speaker Dr. Mark K. Wourms, Executive Director of Bernheim Arboretum and Research Forest. This gem, the size of Manhattan, is just 20 minutes south of Louisville. Dr. Wourms, a botanist with a doctorate in ecology, highlighted big changes, such as the new Visitor Center, the first Platinum LEED-certified building in five states; and Bernheim's fresh vision that includes:

- **Exploring deep connections with nature**, with children's natural play gardens and through art, including a new sculpture being unveiled Oct. 17.
- **★ Leadership in ecological stewardship**, with reintroduction of the Bobwhite quail, controlling the headwaters of Wilson Creek to offer children rare wildlife experiences, and reintroduction of heartier tree varieties.
- **★** Actions Beyond Bernheim's borders, by putting living roofs on Louisville buildings to reduce urban heat islands and slow storm runoff.
- ★ Thought Leadership, including an October conference to explore the impact of free play in nature on a child's development and academic achievement; construction of a new edible garden landscape by interweaving art, science, nature and community to advance state-of-the-art ecological construction techniques.


