September 13, 2018 - ROTARY MEETING RECAP



Our September 13th Rotary Club meeting featured Renee Shaw, Public Affairs Managing Producer and Host. Renee opened by remarking that her presentation, "50 Years of Excellence", could go many directions, from historical to political, given her many roles as host for such broad-ranging programs asKentucky Kentucky Tonightand Legislative Update. However, she made it clear that the main focus of KET's 50 years of excellence is all about ... Education ... "our middle name." Renee emphasized that "access to education is our imperative," and she showed a brief video chronicling the history of placing KET educational

resources in every Kentucky classroom, since launching in 1969.

Renee shared some salient points concerning the critical need for free, public access to educational resources, for Kentucky adults as well as children, and how that mission is both challenged and realized today in an increasingly digital culture. Commenting that "Education is the bridge out of poverty" and that, we need a "higher level of conversation with civility as the focus," Shaw concluded by saying "that's why I do this work ... for kids who use educational resources to achieve great things for their communities."
