Vince Gabbert joined Keeneland in October 2009 and serves as the company's Vice President and Chief Operating Officer. A native of Northern Kentucky, Gabbert graduated from the University of Louisville and the Brandeis School of Law. He was the state Senate Caucus Director for the Kentucky Democratic Party from 1999 to 2002, and directed state Treasurer Jonathan Miller's successful re-election campaign in 2003. He served as the Local Government Division Director for Ross Sinclaire and Associates, a regional investment banking firm, from 2004 to 2007.
