Our September 27th Rotary Club meeting featured Charlie McCoy, Country Hall of Fame musician. Charlie McCoy's performance brought Rotarians to their feet in applause and appreciation for the world-class talent they witnessed. Most of Mr. McCoy's "presentation" time was spent with musical entertainment, accompanied by members of the Rockin' Rotary Band - although he did relate several stories of how he started in music with a veritable "who's who" of the Country Music Hall of Fame. For the purposes of chronicling his achievements in these minutes, Past President Tony's introductory notes are provided as follows:

"It's an honor to introduce Charlie McCoy today as the unquestioned and peerless master of his instrument [the harmonica]. Period. Charlie can make this small instrument laugh, weep, scream, holler, whistle, bark and even talk. And, he can play several other instruments expertly, too. He was elected to the Country Music Hall of Fame in 2009. He has performed with a few artists you may have heard of: Elvis Presley, Loretta Lynn, Paul Simon, Joan Baez, Johnny Cash, Bob Dylan, Ringo Starr, Perry Como, Kris Kristofferson, Waylon Jennings, and others. His album Good Time Charlie was #1 on the Country Charts. He is a Grammy Award winner and has earned CMA awards. Do you remember the variety show, Hee Haw? Well, Charlie was musical director of that show for nearly 20 years. Rotarians, sharing his stories and talent, it's our pleasure to welcome Charlie McCoy."
