Gill Holland is a Norwegian-American Spirit Award-nominated film producer and developer of The Green Building in Louisville, KY. Holland grew up in North Carolina and has produced more than100 feature films. Holland founded cineBLAST! which the Hollywood Reporter in 1999 and 2000 called one of the top ten production companies in New York City. He sold cineBLAST! in 2000 at the height of the tech boom. September 3 Meeting: Washington Update by U.S. Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell



We were honored to have guest speaker, Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell. It was an exciting meeting with 47 guests and numerous reporters who had come to hear the guest speaker. President Greg mentioned during the introduction that McConnell had contracted polio at the age of two, and he stated the fact that, due to the efforts of Rotary, we are very close to eradicating polio worldwide (except for only three countries). In response, Mitch began his presentation by recalling childhood memories, and shared the importance of his mother's 24/7 care and attentiveness to his being able to overcome the effects of polio. The rest of McConnell's presentation included updates on activities in D.C. Most questions were answered, but a few were not. (more here)
