# Presentation Title: "Celebrating 50 Years of Service to the Commonwealth"

Renee Shaw is managing producer of KET's public affairs programming and content and currently serves as host of KET's *Kentucky Tonight* and *Connections with Renee* Shaw. During sessions of the Kentucky General Assembly, she produces and hosts KET's nightly *Legislative Update*, a half-hour recap of the day's legislative news. In election season, she hosts KET's live primary and election night coverage, and throughout the year she

serves as a contributing producer and for several other KET public affairs programs and series.

Shaw has been the face and producing force behind KET's comprehensive legislative coverage since 2001. Her respected, insightful reporting on an array of community and minority affairs issues has been the hallmark of her own series, *Connections with Renee Shaw*, since its launch in 2005.

# September 6, 2018 - ROTARY MEETING RECAP



Our September 6th Rotary Club meeting featured **Dr. Neeli Bendapudi, President of the University of Louisville.** Before delivering her speech, "Competing Through Service," Dr.
Bendapudi acknowledged that she is gratefully part of three generations of beneficiaries of Rotary scholarships. She noted that the Club's mission of service above self is, "what sustains us," adding, "if you're not prepared to serve, you're not prepared to lead." Dr. Bendapudi cogently pointed to parallels between the critical role of service in the success of business and the "spirit of service" which she is committed to developing as a culture at every level of staff and operations for the University of Louisville.

Dr. Bendapudi then enumerated the key service challenges in higher education as the four "I"s: Intangible, Inconsistency, Inseparability, and Inventory.

Dr. Bendapudi concluded by pointing out critical dependencies in delivering and improving the highest level of service at UofL: In order for it to be a great place to learn, it has to be a great place to work, which requires a great community to invest in it. It is either a vicious or virtuous cycle, in which diversity is required to make the difference.
