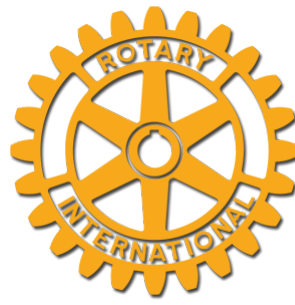

This Week's Speaker October 14th - Butch Mosby, Sponsor 4 Success



Butch Mosby - President - Sponsor 4 Success

Butch Mosby was born in 1972 in Louisville, Kentucky and grew up in the West End off Algonquin Parkway. He attended KIBL Crest Seminary, Barritt Traditional Middle School, and Louisville Area High School. He was active in sports since the age of 6, playing football, basketball, baseball, tennis and soccer. In high school he was the Vice President of the school's student council and served as the captain of the football team. He also played tennis and was a member of the tennis team at Barritt. He attended the University of Louisville and graduated with a Bachelor's degree in Business Administration. He also played tennis for the Louisville Cardinals and finished 5th in the Kentucky State Championships. He worked at a law firm and then started his own business, where he started business management. As the starting quarterback for Bowling Green, he broke the all-time passing records with the longest completion of a pass in a single game (133 in a row) and the highest completion percentage in a game (93.7%).

From college he went to Germany to play tennis professionally in the ATP, where he participated in the East-End. While in Germany he continued into the music industry and successfully became a recording artist, signed to 80 records and hit the charts in Germany, France, Austria, Switzerland and several other European countries. His single "Bang Bang" went #1 in Germany. After a sports and entertainment career, he returned to the US and entered corporate America working in various roles as a member manager for IBM.com and then Exelon for 7 years. In 2009, he was asked to join a start-up called Sponsor.com. He successfully closed a significant round of funding and became the CEO of the company before majority share was sold to a private equity group in 2018.

Butch Mosby is the founder and now President of Sponsor 4 Success, an organization that seeks to engage as a long-term community partner - dedicated to supporting the future success of the children, teens, young adults, families, and seniors in our local communities.

Lauren Coulter is a pharmacist turned restaurateur. After graduating pharmacy school, she and husband Chad Coulter opened Louisville's first "paint and sip" business. In 2014, they shifted into the restaurant scene by opening LouVino, a southern inspired small plates and wine bar restaurant. They grew LouVino to five locations in Louisville, Indianapolis, and Cincinnati before shifting gears to start Biscuit Belly. The first Biscuit Belly location opened in May 2019, and two additional locations have opened in Louisville and Evansville. The Coulters are currently targeting 4-5 additional corporate locations and at least 25 franchise locations in development by the end of 2021.

Think of this as a challenge grant. The Club has earned Rotary Foundation Recognition Points through contributions to the Rotary Foundation.

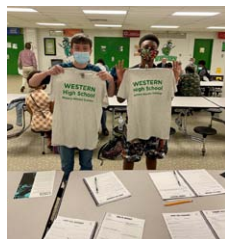
